#### 2.2.2 COLLABORATIVE TASKS

St Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women Ernakulam being blessed with a vibrant team of youth teacher trainees led by a bunch of innovative and proactive teacher educators. A variety of academic and co curricular collaborative activities are conducted and practiced every year. Academic activities include Microteaching, Link Practice, Discussion, Demonstration, Criticism, Peer Evaluation, and Peer Feedback and Peer Tutoring, Yoga, Theatre arts, SUPW, Field Trip, Community Camp, Extension Activities, Field trips, Social services and club activities. Along with the the academic activities a variety of online and offline collaborative events are organized on and off the campus including study tours, field visits, community living camp, and community based extension programmes.

#### Collaborative Learning in a more creative and motivating experiential way

Peer Group is an informal group of people who share similar or equal status and who are roughly of the same age group. A situation in which students work together to search for understanding, meaning, solutions or to create a product of their learning A situation in which two or more people learn or attempt to learn something together and capitalize on one another's resources and skills- learn by sharing experiences. We value it as a simultaneous give and take process, democratic in nature where proponents believe that interactive learning sessions promotes critical thinking, increases interest, achieve higher levels of thought and retain information longer.

Our collaboration starts from classroom level, institutional level, tie up with miodel schools and other teaching practice schools, Other teacher education institutions and Universities and academic bodies and online collaboration with eminent academicians and experts aboard and includes both face-face conversations and online discussions

Some of the activities include collaborative writing, group projects, debates and joint problem solving, collaborative script- structures the process by creating roles and mediating interactions while allowing flexibility in dialogue and activities- objectives, sequence,

activities. Our practices include online collaboration with Google Meet, Zoom, Google Classroom, WhatsApp, and file sharing classroom discussions are more lively with the ability to record ideas.

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In thesis circles the research scholars work with supervisor collaboratively coach and supervise on final research projects.

Computer supported collaborative learning is followed where technology is used in a learning environment to help mediate and support group interactions, to regulate tasks and mediate acquisition of new knowledge by both students and practitioners.

Unlike the traditional classroom setup in collaborative classroom students too are given an equal role of a teacher like a facilitator where they share the responsibility of assessing the study patterns. In a flexible way students too involved in planning and designing tasks, setting goals and an opportunity for self assessment and caters to heterogeneous groups.

#### **Teaching Techniques adopted**





#### LINK PRACTICE REPORT

As part of B.Ed Curriculum, we have Link practice as one of our practical ,which could be considered as the substantial step in the domain of teaching after micro teaching. Micro-teaching concentrates on specific teaching behaviours and provides opportunity for practising teaching under controlled conditions. Whereby link practice is the integration of skills. So through micro-teaching, the behaviour of the teacher and pupil is modified and the teaching-learning process is more effective by the skill training. Having armed the teacher trainees with a battery of teaching sub skills,the next stage is the integration of those sub skills into the major skill.

Link practice was organized on 8th of november 2022. It was a one day programme, which marked the most vital step of our teaching. The entire class was divided into 2 groups, each consists of 8 members. Every student teacher presented their classes in front of their peers for a period of not more than 15 minutes. Link practice was conducted on two classrooms of social science.

It focuses on sharpening and developing specific teaching skills and eliminating errors. This helped us to build confidence and to be prepared for a variety of classroom scenarios. Aspiring teachers like us can get instant feedback, which they can apply in the next round of teaching. This helps in strengthening not only our skills but also our teaching methods, and modify and improve our classroom behavior in the desired direction.
