Programme Report

The student teachers undergo a series of preparatory activities in readiness for their school-based practice and internships. To further their readiness and hone critical skills, the institution organized an orientation session on 'Formulating Learning Objectives' on 22^{nd} December 2022, at the college.

The session extensively covered the major domains and various factors within each domain, providing concrete examples for guidance. The focus was on understanding the process of formulating effective learning objectives, which play a pivotal role in education.


Learning objectives serve as a critical framework for educational activities, be it lessons, activities, curricula, or entire courses. They define the skills and knowledge that students are expected to acquire during their educational journey. Effective learning objectives exhibit certain key features, such as being student-centered, specific, measurable, achievable, result-oriented and time-bound. These objectives form the bedrock upon which education and assessment are structured, outlining the course content and evaluation criteria.

The orientation session also delved into Bloom's Taxonomy, a widely used tool for educational assessment. Bloom's Taxonomy aids in developing learning objectives and selecting appropriate terminology to articulate them effectively. Following the theoretical explanations, the student teachers were divided into four groups for collaborative discussions. Each group chose a specific topic within their respective subjects and worked on crafting learning objectives under the expert guidance of the teacher educators.

Through this collaborative process, errors and inaccuracies in the learning objectives formulated by the student teachers were identified and corrected, allowing for a refinement of their skills. The entire session concluded at 3 PM.

The orientation session proved to be a resounding success in equipping student teachers with the knowledge and skills required for crafting effective learning objectives. This comprehensive session not only deepened their understanding of the domains and factors involved but also provided them with practical insights into the process. Overall, it was a valuable opportunity for the student teachers to acquire knowledge and skills that will undoubtedly enhance their professional capabilities as aspiring educators.

The college organized an orientation program led by faculty member Aswathy D.V for teacher educands of the M.Ed. 2021-23 batch, focusing on formulating learning objectives within unit plans. Programme Report

The institution organized an orientation session on Content Analysis/Content Mapping on 23rd December 2022 from 9AM to 11AM at the college. The purpose of the orientation session was to prepare the student teachers for practice teaching or internships and to enhance certain significant skills and competencies. The orientation session was organized for the B.Ed. student teachers. The session was carried out by teacher educators





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of respective departments at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam. The orientation session started exactly at 10 AM by the Teacher Educators of respective departments at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam. The session was organized for the student teachers to help them utilize the opportunity to enhance their knowledge and competence which would reflect excellence in both their academic and professional performance. During the session, the teacher educators introduced and explained about the preparation and importance of content analysis in the teaching process. Content analysis or content mapping is a teaching and assessment strategy. It makes it possible for teachers, coaches, and teacher educators to conceptualize the sequence, scope, and relational features of the subject being taught. Teachers can plan learning activities with the aid of content analysis. By organizing and arranging the instructional tasks, content mapping emphasizes specialized topic understanding. Content maps can be used in a variety of ways to support teachers' professional development, including as a tool for teachers to define the material to be taught in a unit of instruction; a teaching tool for imparting subjectmatter expertise, and an assessment tool for gauging preservice and in-service teachers' subject-matter expertise. The teacher educators gave a clear idea on the various factors to be considered while writing the content analysis to the student teachers. After the theoretical explanation, the student teachers were divided into four groups for discussion. Each group of students drafted content according to the prescribed steps of content analysis. After drafting, each group presented it in the classroom. Instant feedbacks were given by the teacher educator and peers, and necessary rectifications were made by the student teachers. The entire session winded up at 3 PM.


The orientation session was successful in instilling adequate knowledge and skills in drafting content analysis or content mapping. The entire orientation session was

Programme Report

The college organized a workshop on lesson plan training from $16^{th} - 21^{st}$ January 2023 for the first year teacher trainees, with the following objectives: to acquaint participants with instructional and curricular objectives and to provide a comprehensive





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understanding of the steps involved in lesson plan preparation. The workshop commenced with teacher educators providing a theoretical foundation on year plans, unit plans, and lesson plans on the first day. Additionally, content analysis procedures specific to each subject were elucidated during the workshop.

On the second day of the workshop, the teacher educators provided instructions to the students regarding the segmentation of content into units for each lesson plan. The student teachers received guidance on structuring units specifically tailored for 45-minute class durations. As part of their lesson plan assignments, the student teachers were tasked with the responsibility of choosing and preparing a total of five units to ensure comprehensive coverage of their teaching materials.

On the third day, the practical phase of the workshop took place. The teacher educators divided the student teachers into small groups of 4 or 5 members, with each group assigned the same units for their lesson plan preparation. The teacher educators reiterated the step-by-step approach to lesson planning, providing thorough guidance during the process. Sufficient scaffolding sessions were conducted to support the participants as they engaged in group activities. As a result, all group members effectively completed one lesson plan, ensuring their understanding and competence in the lesson planning process.

On the fourth and fifth days of the workshop, student teachers were actively involved in crafting their lesson plans using the assigned units. Teacher educators provided continuous guidance and corrections to assist them in this endeavor. Subsequently, the participants presented each step of their lesson plans and addressed any errors in accordance with the suggestions and feedback provided by the educator. This collaborative process





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ensured that the student teachers refined their lesson plans and gained a deeper understanding of the planning and correction aspects of effective teaching.

The workshop offered numerous valuable benefits to the teacher trainees. It equipped them with essential skills in lesson planning, allowing them to create well-structured and effective lesson plans. This practical experience was instrumental in translating theoretical knowledge into actionable teaching strategies. It also fostered a culture of collaborative learning, as trainees engaged in group activities and presentations, benefiting from peer interactions and feedback. Moreover, the corrections and suggestions provided by teacher educators during the workshop allowed trainees to refine their lesson plans, promoting continuous improvement in their teaching practices. This experience not only boosted their confidence but also contributed significantly to their professional development as future educators. Overall, the workshop provided a holistic and practical foundation for trainees, preparing them to excel in their teaching careers and make a positive impact in the classroom.

Academic Year 2021-22 (16/11/2021-19/11/2021):








Programme Report

The college organized an enlightening workshop on Theatre and Drama for the firstyear teacher trainees. The workshop was expertly guided by Mr. Arun Kumar S, a seasoned and proficient theatre artist. To facilitate the workshop, the six optional student





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teachers were divided into two separate batches, known as Batch A and Batch B. Each of these groups consisted of three optional students. Programme Report

The college organized Annual sports day on March 24, 2023, at the college ground, aiming to identify and celebrate the diverse abilities of its students. The annual sports meet was open to both first-year and second-year B.Ed. student teachers and was meticulously coordinated by Dr. Ceby George, Assistant Professor in Physical Education.





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The sports day commenced promptly at 8:30 AM with a prayer, followed by an oath-taking ceremony led by the sports captain. Ms. Vrinda Suresh, the Student Sports Secretary, delivered a warm welcome address to kick off the annual sports meet. The event was officially inaugurated by Dr. Alice Joseph, the Principal of the college. 



Furthermore, the importance of delivering clear and specific instructions was stressed and teachers were encouraged to include CWSN students in group activities or provide them with necessary peer support, buddy systems, or scribes when needed.

The class proved to be highly informative, equipping aspiring teachers with the knowledge and skills required to effectively support and educate children with special needs. It not only raised awareness about the principles of inclusive education but also instilled a sense of preparedness among student teachers to create an inclusive and supportive learning environment that caters to the diverse needs of all students. Dr. Sudheesha K S's expertise and guidance undoubtedly enriched the students' understanding of inclusive education and their ability to implement inclusive teaching practices.




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this, the student teachers were tasked with choosing a topic that most students found challenging in the achievement test.

Based on this analysis, the teacher educator conducted an orientation on how to provide remedial lessons to the students, emphasizing the importance of post-test assessments following this remedial sessions. The report on the diagnostic test was subsequently submitted on 23rd January 2023. This training program aimed to equip student teachers with the skills and knowledge necessary for educational diagnosis, ensuring that they can identify and address the unique learning needs of their students effectively.

Specific applications and software such as Flipping book and Flip PDF Plus were discussed in detail during the session.

A digital lesson plan, a crucial component of online teaching, was emphasized as a set of instructions for conducting digital lessons and educational activities. Planning digital lessons is the first step in applying thematic curriculum concepts, ensuring that learning objectives are clearly defined, goals for learning are established, and progress indicators are in place to monitor learners' advancement towards these goals. During the training session, the resource person provided hands-on guidance to the student teachers, helping them navigate and create various online tools to support their future teaching endeavors.





The training session concluded at 11 AM, marking the end of an enriching and informative experience. The 'Different Applications for Online Classes' workshop successfully imparted valuable knowledge to student participants about a variety of online tools and platforms designed for online classes. Moreover, it played a pivotal role in enhancing the ICT-based skills of the student teachers. Overall, the session was informative and beneficial, equipping the student teachers with essential competencies for the evolving landscape of digital education.

Programme Report

The college organized a workshop on the creation of ICT resource materials during the first semester of the academic year. Information and Communication Technology (ICT) plays a vital role in fostering motivation, enhancing student achievement and expanding learning opportunities. As part of the B.Ed. curriculum, specifically Edu107.2, the college tasked student teachers with developing and presenting learning resource materials for learners, with an emphasis on ICT-supported materials related to school-based topics. This initiative aimed to extend the scope of students' learning.

To facilitate this practical task, teacher educators provided comprehensive instructions on how to prepare ICT resource materials aligned with the high school syllabus.





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Additionally, a value-added course led by Mrs. Reshmi, titled 'An Introduction to Technology-Enhanced Instructional Platforms,' played a significant role in helping student teachers prepare these resource materials. The course covered various aspects, including creating Google Forms for conducting quizzes in schools, using the Canva app to create engaging and diverse presentation styles, developing online flipbooks, and designing realistic book layouts using PowerPoint. Moreover, the course explored the creation of animated videos using video animation software, a valuable tool for conveying complex concepts and enhancing student understanding.


With the knowledge and guidance provided by the faculty, student teachers embarked on the task of creating their ICT resource materials. They selected topics from the 8th, 9th, or 10th standard SCERT textbooks and further broke down these topics into subtopics. Using a variety of ICT resources, they developed comprehensive materials, with a primary focus on PowerPoint presentations enriched with audio files, video clips, animations and other multimedia elements. These materials were thoughtfully designed to cater to the academic needs of students.

To ensure the authenticity and verification of their work, student teachers submitted their ICT resource materials along with CD proofs, adhering to the specified guidelines and requirements. This workshop provided student teachers with practical experience in ICT to create effective educational resources for their future teaching endeavors.

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

Programme Report

The college organized one day field trip for the student teachers, which prove to be an essential component of the learning process.
