





WOMEN CELL ACTIVITIES REPORT 2022-23

PROGRAMME REPORT

St Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam organized a Food Fest on a very special day. The food fest was conducted on 1st November 2022 on the auspicious day of 66th Kerala Piravi. The program was coordinated by Dr.Sr.Soya Mathew,. Sr.Rosy Tintu and Natural Science optional had the overall incharge of programme. Since the food fest was organized on an ethnic day, all the staff and students came in an ethnic look.

The food fest was named under the title "RUCHI" along with the six optionals giving six different attractive titles for their stall. English optional of St Joseph College named their stall as "Bukateria". Malayalam optional named their stall as "Mallusmakkani". Maths optional named their stall as "Matelicious". Natural science named their stall as "AavoKhaavo-MalabariDhaba". Physical Science named their stall as "Thaninadanswaadh" and the Social Science optional named their stall as "Homemade Delectatio".



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After programs related to Kerala Piravi in the assembly, the program coordinator Dr.Sr.Soya gave a two hour preparation time for the fest from 09:30am-11:30am. Meanwhile the students of individual optional did the decorations of the stalls and did their food preparation. The food fest was held from 11:30am-01:30pm. The venue of the program was at Multi-purpose hall. The ChiefGuest of the program, SrLincy A.P., the Principal inchargeofSt Joseph College of D.El.Ed and also an ex-student of our college, officially inaugurated the program. It was an event where everyone's coordination and unity was seen throughout. The event was a great opportunity for students to exhibit their efficiency in cooking and to exhibit their cooking skills.

English optional's stall "Bukateria" contained several food items which included: a combo of keralanaadanporotta with chicken curry, carrot cake, chocolate muffin, small jalebi and variety sweet delicacy badushah. The optional claimed that they had a huge hike in the selling of porotta-chicken curry combo and badushah. The remaining items were also sold in good numbers. They gained an overall profit of Rs 660 which was handed over for the charity program.

Malayalam optional's stall "Mallusmakkani" mainly focused on selling local dishes which included: Mulakbaji, Cauliflower baji, Muttabaji, Chapathi and chicken curry, Kappa and chammanthi, Sambaram, Tea, Watermelon and Pineapple cuttings and Cone icecream. They ran their stall very well and earned an overall profit of Rs 1637 which was contributed for the charity program.

Maths optional's stall "Matelicious" included the food items: Frankie, Chicken sandwich, Chicken noodles and Veg noodles, Chicken cutlet, and Pazhampori-beef combo. They had a live kitchen with food items noodles, frankie and sandwich amongst which frankie was the centre of attraction. Also their Pazhampori-beef combo got hit well. Different flavours of corn, lays chat, chocolate drink and lime juice were also included in the stall. The lively participation of all the students in running the live kitchen as well as stall, helped them earn a profit of Rs 1700, to be donated to the charity group.

Natural Science named the stall as "AavoKhaavo- MalabariDhaba" with food items as a fusion of Punjabi food items and ethnic Malabari items and many more which included: Samosa chat, Panipuri, Dahipuri, Bhelpuri, Lassi, Unnakaya, Malabarikozhukatta, Elanji,








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Awareness Rally on Anti-Drug Campaign

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

Programme Report

The consumption rate of various narcotic substances in the country has seen a 70% increase in the past eight years and the number continue to rise. As per the National Survey on Extent and Pattern of Substance Use in India (2019), 16 crore people (14.6%) between the age of 10 to 75 years are current users of alcohol, about 3.1 crore individuals (2.8%) are cannabis users, Overall opioid users 2.06% and 0.55% require treatment services. 1.18 crore are current users of sedatives and it is estimated that about 8.5 lakh people are injecting drugs. Thus drug is becoming a menace to our country and for the whole world. Prevention is the only way forward to protect the upcoming generation from the threat of narcotic abuse. So a strong awareness should be created among community so that the spread of narcotics could be prevented.



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St Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam in coordination with Excise Department, Ernakulam organised various events named "Jaagaran" to create awareness on narcotic abuse in the month of October and November, 2022. The Anti- Narcotic club in association with IQAC hosted the events. Whole programme was led by College Anti-Narcotic club staff Co-ordinators Dr Sicily AA, Dr Betty P J and Dr Smitha Jose. The Ernakulam Excise department also provided immense support for the activities. Various optional got responsibility of organising various events under Jaagaran. Totally five events were conducted throughout the month of October and November, which included:

□ Anti- Narcotic rally
 □ Painting and Speech competitions
 □ Awareness Talk for Parents
 □ Flash mob
 □ Formation of Human Chain

First event organised under Jaagaran was an Anti-narcotic Rally. It was conducted on 1st October 2022 with an aim to create awareness among public about drug abuse. Event was also a part of Gandhi Jayanti celebration. The rally was flagged off by St Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam Principal Dr Sr. Alice Joseph. Dr Smitha Jose was the staff coordinator of awareness talk and student teachers of first year Social Science optional hosted the online session. A total of 56 parents participated in the session. Ms Sreelakshmi Sudhakaran was the presenter of the event. The session was started with a prayer song by Ms Sukritha S Shenoy. Welcome address was delivered by Mrs Arya T K. Another event conducted in the college under Jaagaran was a painting and speech competition inorder to evaluate the current understanding of drug abuse among student teachers. Programme Report

The consumption rate of various narcotic substances in the country has seen a 70% increase in the past eight years and the number continue to rise. As per the National Survey on Extent and Pattern of Substance Use in India (2019), 16 crore people (14.6%) between the age of 10 to 75 years are current users of alcohol, about 3.1 crore individuals (2.8%) are cannabis users, Overall opioid users 2.06% and 0.55% require treatment services. 1.18 crore are current users of sedatives and it is estimated that about 8.5 lakh people are injecting drugs. Thus drug is becoming a menace to our country and for the whole world. Prevention is the only way forward to protect the upcoming generation from the threat of narcotic abuse. So a strong awareness should be created among community so that the spread of narcotics could be prevented.

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St Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam in coordination with Excise Department, Ernakulam organised various events named "Jaagaran" to create awareness on narcotic abuse in the month of October and November, 2022. The Anti- Narcotic club in association with IQAC hosted the events. Whole programme was led by College Anti-Narcotic club staff Co-ordinators Dr Sicily AA, Dr Betty P J and Dr Smitha Jose. The Ernakulam Excise department also provided immense support for the activities. Various optional got responsibility of organising various events under Jaagaran. Totally five events were conducted throughout the month of October and November, which included:

 □ Painting and Speech competitions
 □ Awareness Talk for Parents
 □ Flash mob
 □ Formation of Human Chain

First event organised under Jaagaran was an Anti-narcotic Rally. It was conducted on 1st October 2022 with an aim to create awareness among public about drug abuse. Dr Smitha Jose was the staff coordinator of awareness talk and student teachers of first year Social Science optional hosted the online session. A total of 56 parents participated in the session. Ms Sreelakshmi Sudhakaran was the presenter of the event. The session was started with a prayer song by Ms Sukritha S Shenoy. Welcome address was



EVENT REPORT


