

A total of 96 student teachers from St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam participated in the seminar.

The training on career guidance started exactly at 1.00 PM at the college multipurpose hall. The training began with a prayer song by Ms. Aparna Shaju, student teacher from Mathematics Education. The prayer song was succeeded by the welcome speech delivered by Ms. Sneha P.P, student teacher from Natural Science optional. After the welcome speech, Ms. Anu Cleetus, the resource person for the day began the session. The resource person initially gave a brief introduction on the importance of the present training on career guidance. These classes aim to equip individuals with the necessary knowledge and skills to effectively apply various therapeutic techniques in counseling settings.

Objectives

The primary objectives of the orientation and training classes on therapeutic approaches in counseling were as follows:

a) To introduce participants to different therapeutic approaches commonly used in counseling, such as cognitive-behavioral therapy, psychodynamic therapy, humanistic therapy, and solution-focused therapy.





- b) To enhance participants' understanding of the theoretical underpinnings and core concepts of each therapeutic approach.

- f) Integrative Approaches: Introduction to integrative approaches in counseling, which combine elements of different therapeutic approaches to meet the unique needs of clients and foster holistic healing.
- g) Application and Case Studies: Practical application of therapeutic techniques through case studies and group exercises to reinforce learning and skill development.

Methods

The orientation and training classes utilized a variety of instructional methods to engage participants and facilitate effective learning. These methods included:

- a) Lectures and Presentations: Expert facilitators delivered lectures and presentations to provide theoretical knowledge and conceptual frameworks for each therapeutic approach.
- b) Case Studies: Participants engaged in case studies to simulate real-life counseling scenarios and practice applying therapeutic techniques.

- e) Assignments and Assessments: Participants were given assignments and assessments to reinforce their understanding of the content and evaluate their learning prog


Outcomes



The main contents of the training programme are

1) The Teacher as a Guide

Understanding the Role, A teacher acting as a guide assumes the responsibility of leading students on their academic journey. The teacher's role as a guide promotes student autonomy, self-discovery, and critical thinking skills.





- Advantages of Teacher as a Guide

can include workshops, seminars, and ongoing support from qualified counselors or experts in the field.

Integrating specific classes on the teacher's role as a guide and counsellor into the curriculum ensures that students receive consistent support and guidance. These classes can cover topics such as communication skills, empathy, active listening, conflict resolution, and mental health awareness.

c. Collaboration with Support Services

Collaboration with Support Services Collaboration between teachers and support services, such as school counselors, psychologists, or social workers, is crucial for addressing complex student needs. Regular meetings, consultations, and sharing of resources can ensure a holistic approach to supporting students.



Programme Report

St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam in association with Alumni Association and ENTRI app organized a career guidance webinar on 'Teaching Exams - How to Effectively Crack Them' on 5th February 2022 from 1.45 PM to 3.45 PM via online platforms including Google Meet and YouTube. The webinar was organized for the B Ed. student teachers and M Ed. teacher educands of St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam. The webinar was organized with the objective of helping students to learn about various competitive examinations and to help student teachers to understand and learn about scope, learning methodology, strategy, study plan and syllabus of various eligibility exams to crack them effectively. The entire webinar was coordinated by the English Literary Association of St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam. The resource persons for the workshop were Dr. Hema K.J, faculty member from SNM Training College, Moothakkunnam and Dr. Vinu Sreedhar, Faculty Member in Department of Physics from St. Stephens College, Uzhavoor. A total of 207 participants including teacher educands and student teachers from St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam participated in the workshop.


The webinar on 'Teaching Exams- How to Effectively Crack Them' started exactly at 1.45 PM via Google Meet. The webinar began with a brief introduction given by Dr. Hema K.J on ENTRI app and the exact objective behind organizing such a webinar for the students. She reminded all of the Participants that the present webinar would help them in getting to know more about the competitive eligibility examinations, scope of employment etc. after completing their course. She reminded the participants that the webinar would be a clear-cut answer to all the questions that would rise in their minds about their future career. After the brief introduction session, Dr. Hema K.J started the webinar session. She mentioned that for a graduate in B Ed or M Ed has three fields in education to focus on which are government sector, aided sector and unaided sector. First, she discussed about the K-TET examination. Dr. Hema K.J reminded all the students that the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 has brought about a lot of holistic changes in education and thus it becomes more important to



clear examinations like K-TET to move forward in career with a graduation in education. She mentioned that only candidates who have cleared K-TET examination would be able to get appointed and continue their profession in schools in any sector. K-TET is the abbreviation for Kerala Teacher Eligibility Test and it is conducted to determine the eligibility of aspirants to teach in lower primary, upper primary and high school classes in the state of Kerala. K-TET exams are conducted by the Pariksha Bhavan of Kerala. It is held as per the guidelines and regulations laid down by SCERT, NCTE / Depart-ment of General Education of Government of Kerala. K-TET exams are conducted twice a year in offline mode. K-TET exam is 150 minutes. After the general introduction about K-TET examination, the resource person discussed about the various categories of the examination and also the procedure for application, fee structure, and minimum qualification for each structure. After that the resource person moved on to the session where she explained about the question paper patterns and cut off marks and other details about each K-TET exam categories. After the session on K-TET examination carried out by Dr. Hema K.J, the next session was carried out by Dr. Vinu Sreedhar, Faculty Member in Department of Physics from St. Stephens College, Uzhavoor. Dr. Vinu Sreedhar started with explaining the importance of the eligibility examinations and he mentioned that if SET or K-TET examinations are not cleared by one who is pursuing a profession in teaching cannot even apply for PSC (Public Service Commission) exams. After that he presented and explained about the pattern of K-TET and SET. He mentioned about some factors to be considered before studying for examinations. The factors included exam pattern, syllabus to be covered, subject wise marks, previous year question paper patterns and covering the difficult part of the syllabus. The resource person mentioned that considering these factors would help effective cracking of competitive examinations. He also explained about the exam rules and regulations. After the session has been completed, both the resource persons clarified the doubts raised by the students. After the question-and-answer session, feedbacks were collected from the participants via Google Forms. The entire webinar winded up at 3.45 PM.

The webinar on 'Teaching Exams- How to Effectively Crack Them' turned out to be successful in achieving its objectives. The workshop was effective in raising the awareness of students regarding various competitive examinations and their patterns, procedures and much information about them. The entire webinar was fruitful for the students to enhance their knowledge and excel in their future teaching career. The session was very much interactive. The entire webinar was a great experience for the students.









The College provides the opportunity for students to opt for guidance and counselling training programme. After the end of the course, the teacher candidate will be able to get acquainted with the nature of guidance and counselling, develop the ability to organize guidance and counseling programs in the schools, understand the process of guidance and counseling, develop the skills and qualities of a guide and counsellor, develop skills needed for that.

The course was delivered to students through various methods such as lecturediscussion, case studies of guidance and counselling, use of video clips and teaching texts, projects, use of stories based on research and documentation, observations, interviews, recording of observations and experiences, panel or group discussion on psychosocial topics, individual projects, library use, laboratory and ICT-based learning, and psychological testing.

The content of the program includes the meaning, need and importance of guidance and counselling in schools, objectives of guidance and counselling at different levels, e.g., primary, middle school and higher secondary schools, organization of counselling in schools - educational, personal, professional and career counselling. Participants get a clear picture about individual and group counselling. The program emphasizes the understanding that the teacher as a guide and career coach. It also provides a clear overview of career guidance which includes information - components and sources, job analysis, career organization - career Corner, career conversation, career conference, career newsletter, the role of parents in making career decisions, etc.: The student learns about the process and types of guidance and counselling.

The program helps future teachers to understand the basics of guidance and counselling according to various psychological concepts of Behavioural, Psychoanalytic, Humanistic Schools, Gestalt therapy and Transactional analysis. The program helps students understand the stages of guidance and counselling, the need for different stages, make connections, make an action plan, etc. This programme provides a clear overview of the skills and attributes of a councillor and a guide. This will help them to be an effective teacher in the future.

In this course, future teachers will gather detailed information about common behaviour problems in children and youth. 
