COVID - 19 was the time where humans were threatened and united to exterminate the pandemic. The coronavirus, also known as covid-19, is an infectious disease that caused a pandemic in 2019. It is a contagious disease that has spread rapidly all over the world. The deadly virus was discovered in 2019 in Wuhan, China, where it first appeared before spreading worldwide. In March 2019, the World Health Organization (WHO) declared Covid-19 a global pandemic.

The programme was started with the welcome speech of Jessy M.A, Junior Superintendent of the college. The sessions mainly focused on safety protocols of COVID 19. The programme also focused on detailed aspects of how to give mental health support to students and family members. It also dealt with how to identify the COVID-19 symptoms which included fatigue, severe headaches, the common cold, breathing difficulties, loss of appetite, taste and smell, and many more.
