After the inaugural function, the resource person for the workshop, Mr. Jobin Jose, carried out session on digital library using Calibre. The entire workshop session was conducted at the ICT lab of St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam. The resource discussed about the evolution of libraries and the effectiveness of Calibre in transforming libraries into one that fits into the modern information world. For contemporary libraries, keeping up with technology is a significant challenge. The needs and reading choices of library users are evolving. Libraries are essential for rendering the provision of many types of information accessible to its users. Users should have access to e-books in addition to traditional book lending. There are numerous e-books available on the internet; what is needed is a software for keeping track of the collection. Among these, Blio, KooBits, All My Books, Alpha eBooks Manager, GutenPy and Calibre are significant. These applications help in the management of the e-book collection, catalogue creation, e-book reading, etc. Calibre is one of the efficient software for e-book management.

Calibre is an e-book management software that has capabilities for e-book management in libraries. It is a very user-friendly personal e-book manager. This fully accessible software may be utilized in libraries to create e-book-based content servers, archive news, convert between e-book formats, and other activities. Calibre is relatively simple, in contrast to other digital library software and library automation tools. Nearly all of the important settings are accessible directly from the main window, and its design is highly attractive. Calibre is a complete set of tools with an intuitive user interface for all your e-book needs. It has an all-inone reader, an e-book converter, a news aggregator, a manager, and a tool for online library sharing. The ease of use and simplicity of Calibre are significant features. Anyone can use Calibre without any training or introduction. Under the terms of the GNU General Public License version 3, Calibre is freely downloadable and compatible with Windows, Linux and Macintosh operating systems. The resource person also explained on how to install Calibre in computers and also hot to add books to the collection. Typically, books or electronic books are uploaded to the library one at a time. But, adding books to the collections in Calibre is a simple process that may be accomplished in bulk as well. Just dragging a book to the Calibre window will add it to the collection. Click on the add book icon in the main window, then pick the necessary choice from the pop-up list, if you want to add several books to the collection or the same book in different e-book formats. The list offers bulk book additions. A collection of ebooks in various formats is instantly added in a matter of seconds. Calibre provides one more way to add books to the library. Create a directory to house e-books and provide its name in

the preference. Each file placed in the folder will instantly be added to the library of electronic books. The resource person discussed about the various features of Calibre including metadata harvesting, search and browse facility, web server, email server etc. The resource person also pointed out its limitations. The lack of a full-text search feature in Calibre software is one of its main drawbacks. The full text search is not supported by Calibre. Several metadata standards, like MARC and Dublin Core, are not supported by Calibre because libraries are not its main target demographic. Despite its limitations, Calibre is a simple and useful tool for e-book management. Calibre is unquestionably a useful tool for managing e-books in libraries. With capabilities like the built-in web server and metadata harvesting etc., Calibre is a promising and essential tool for libraries.

After the session, feedback were collected from the participants. Majority of the participants gave positive feedback and pointed out that the workshop helped them gain relevant information and thereby enhance their knowledge and skills. After the feedback session, Dr. Marin Jose, St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam delivered the vote of thanks for the programme. After that, certificates were distributed to all of the participants. Photographs together with the resource person were taken and after lunch was provided to all of the participants. The entire programme winded up at 4 PM. The workshop on, 'Digital Library using Calibre' conducted as part of Administrative Training Programme was extremely fruitful. 

At present, there is a drastic need to continue education through alternative ways. There is an urgent need of innovate methods and strategies for the neo normal conditions by preserving the merits of normal educational system. This will give path for a new vision and style for futuristic normal in education. Assessing this need, the theme for the international web conference which is, 'Education in Normal, Neo normal and Futuristic Normal' organized by St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam, was selected. St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam and Council for Educational Administration and Management (CEAM) in collaboration with Kerala State Higher Education Council (KSHEC), Council for Teacher Education Foundation (CTEF) Kerala and Association of International Researchers of Indian Origin (AIRIO) organized the International Multidisciplinary Conference on 'Education in Normal, Neo Normal and Futuristic Normal' on 15th, 16th and 17th of March 2022 via Google Meet. The faculty programme coordinator for the International multidisciplinary conference was Dr. Soya Mathew, Assistant Professor in Education at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam.

Day 1 (15th March 2022)

The first day of the international multidisciplinary conference on 'Education in Normal, Neo normal and Futuristic Normal' was on 15th March 2022. The conference started exactly at 9.15 AM via Google Meet. The time between 9.15 AM and 9.30 AM was allotted for the participants for logging in to Google Meet. The inauguration session of the conference started at 9.30 AM. The invocation was done by the students of St. Joseph College of Teacher



Education for Women, Ernakulam. Dr. Alice Joseph, Principal at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women Ernakulam and the general convener of the multidisciplinary online conference, delivered the welcome address for the programme. Dr. Alice Joseph officially welcomed all the dignitaries and all the other participants to the international multidisciplinary conference. The welcome speech by Dr. Alice Joseph was followed by the presidential address delivered by Rev. Sr. Pavana CMC, Councillor of Department of Education at CMC Vimala Province Ernakulam. Rev. Sr. Pavana emphasized the need of the hour to address some of the most critical issues on the educational landscape by turning our attention to what we have learned from the global reset of many things including education. After the presidential address was the inaugural ceremony of the international conference. Dr. Rajan Varghese, Member Secretary, KSHEC (Kerala State Higher Education Council) inaugurated the international multidisciplinary web conference. During the inaugural speech, Dr. Rajan Varghese mentioned the effects of techno capitalism, how knowledge work as both commodity and capital in economy, importance of life related academic activities, virtual and actual higher education systems, dimensions of future of higher education and knowledge economy. Most Rev. Dr. Joseph Mar Thomas, Bishop of Bathery Diocese in Wayanad delivered the blessing speech for the web conference. He pointed out the changing role of teachers to knowledge explorers. He identified and explained three major changes taking place in educational field as internal effectiveness, thrust in interface effectiveness and world class educational movement. The key note address of the webinar was given by Ms. Stephanie Egger Ph.D., Co-Founder & D., Co-Fou Creative Partner at 'The Invisible Lab', post disciplinary Design Laboratory in Austria. She gave a comprehensive explanation of how designing tools like a portfolio may benefit education. Dr. Grace Annie Mathews Chairperson of Council for Teacher Education Foundation (CTEF), Kerala, Dr. M.S. Geetha, Chairperson of Kerala and Association of International Researchers of Indian Origin (AIRIO), Kerala Chapter and Dr. Nimmy Maria Oommen, National Secretary of Council for Educational Administration and Management (CEAM) delivered the words of appreciation and shred their views about education in normal, neo normal and futuristic normal scenario.

After the delivery of words of appreciation by chairperson of AIRIO and National Secretary of CEAM, the panel presentation session started from 11.45 PM to 1.15 PM. The panelists for the presentation session were Dr. N Johnson, National Vice President of Council for Educational Administration and Management (CEAM) and HOD in charge at Department of Lifelong Learning at Alagappa University in Karaikudi in Tamil Nadu; Dr. Reni Francis,



Principal at MES's Pillai College of Education and Research, Mumbai in Maharashtra; Dr. Pratiksha Dixit, Principal at Springfields, Moradabad, Uttar Pradesh; and Dr. Joby Joy Kurian, Assistant Professor in Mathematics Education at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam. Dr. Protiva Rani Karmaker, Former Director at Institute of Modern Languages (IML) at Jagannath University in Dhaka, Bangladesh presented the theme paper on 'Education for futuristic Changes and Challenges'. The discernment in selecting tools and methods for effective learning is very important. Education has transformed into a blended and flipped paradigm and is no longer static or conventional. The training programs for teachers should concentrate and emphasize the development of skills such as problem solving, communication, critical thinking, presentation, practical application, risk management and others. More emphasis should be placed on the metacognition process. Future education should act as a catalyst to eradicate injustice, poverty, and other social ills. Followed by the theme paper, panel discussion took place which was moderated by Dr. Neelu Gautham Ghosh, Chairperson of Council for Educational Administration and Management (CEAM), Gujarat and Principal at DD Choksi College of Education, Palanpur, Gujarat. The first panelist was Dr. N Johnson and presented his views on blended learning in higher education. Education is now more accessible to everyone due to the advancement of technology. All facets of education had been taken over by technology, and educators need to accept it and adapt in order to succeed. The three key elements of neo- normal blended classrooms are visibility, priority, and autonomy. Dr. Reni Francis shared the perspectives on inclusive education. During the discussion, various facets of inclusion, such as challenges and obstacles, were clearly highlighted. Access to education, increasing awareness, establishing an identity, having a support network, and empowerment are important components of inclusion. 'Pedagogical revolutions with technological Interventions' were the topic shared by Dr. Pratiksha Dixit. The Futuristic education incorporates four key changes including internet adaptability, technological advancements, distributed living and learning, and a put more emphasis on problem-solving. After passing through Globalization, Robotization, and Digitalization, the normal trends turn into Automation. Learning skills, literary skills, and life skills are classified as the skills of the twenty-first century.





The second day of the international multidisciplinary conference on 'Education in Normal, Neo normal and Futuristic Normal' was on 16th March 2022. The conference started exactly at 9.00 AM via Google Meet. A total of 5 minutes were allotted for the participants for logging in to Google Meet. After login process, the conference started with a prayer lead by Dr. Marin Jose, Assistant Professor in English Education at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam. The keynote address for the day were delivered by Dr. Anjuli Ahooja from Appleby College in Ontario, Canada and Dr. Lungsang Zeliang from Department of Education at Nagaland University, Kohima Campus in Nagaland. The keynote address was succeeded by the panel presentations for the day. The panelists for the presentations of the day were Dr. Yashpal Netragaonkar, Associate Professor at MIT World Peace University in Pune, Maharashtra; Dr. Chetna Thapa, Secretary of CEAM, Uttarakhand and Assistant Professor at DWT College in Dehradun, Uttarakhand; Dr. Rashmi Singh, Assistant Professor at SS Khanna Girls Degree College at University of Allahabad in Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh; and Dr. Marin Jose, Assistant Professor in English Education at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam. The second theme paper of the Web conference was presented by Dr. Daisy Bora Talukdar, Professor at Department of Education at Dibrugarh University, Assam and the Patron of CEAM, Assam on 'Reimaging Education for lifelong Learning'. She discussed the importance of lifelong learning, lateral entry into the educational system, modifications to the learning and teaching process, gender policies in lifelong learning, and how we might put the concept of an empowered society into reality. 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elaborated the data on Characteristics of Outcome based curriculum, curriculum resources with





PROGRAMME REPORT

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell of St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam organized a Professional Development Programme on 'Preparation of SSR and AQAR' on 17th and 18th of November 2021 from 9.30 AM to 3.30 PM at the M.Ed. seminar hall in the college. The programme was organized for the faculty members of St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam. The faculty coordinators of the programme were Dr. Josephine Joseph, IQAC Coordinator and Assistant Professor in Physical Science Education and Dr. Siji John, Assistant Professor in Social Science Education at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam. The resource persons for the programme were Dr. Kala M.S, IQAC Coordinator and Associate Professor at Department of Physics and Dr. Usha Nair, Associate Professor at Department of Hindi from St. Teresa's College, Ernakulam. A total of 15 faculty members from St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam participated in the programme.

The programme on 'Preparation of SSR and AQAR' conducted by St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam started exactly at 9.30 AM at the M.Ed. seminar hall in the college. The programme started with a prayer. The prayer was succeeded by the welcome speech for the programme. Dr. Josephine Joseph, IQAC Coordinator and Assistant Professor in Physical Science Education at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam delivered the welcome address for the training programme. Dr. Josephine Joseph officially welcomed the resource person and all of the faculty members to the programme. After the welcome address, Dr. Kala M.S, one of the resource persons carried out the session on preparation of SSR and AQAR. The resource person started the training programme by explaining about the importance of Self-Study Reports (SSR) and Annual Quality Assurance Reports (AQAR) in NAAC (National Assessment and Accreditation Council) accreditation of the institution. The resource person started with a reminder to the faculty members that Self Study Reports or SSR has a significant role in the accreditation process of the institution. She reminded that the present training programme can be utilized by the participant faculty members to enhance their knowledge and skills in carrying out works so as to achieve better grade in accreditation of the institution. NAAC (National Assessment and Accreditation Council) is a government organization in India that assesses and accredits higher education institutions in India. NAAC, during the assessment, assess the institution's activities and other functioning via visit, self-study report and annual reports. The NAAC accreditation process follows a systematic, objective and a holistic approach for institutional improvement.

The development of Self-Study Reports or SSR by the institution is the crucial step in the assessment and accreditation process. Institutions should prepare the SSR in accordance with the NAAC's requirements and guidelines provided. The institution's SSR reports should contain evidences of involvement with the guiding principles, evidence that the institution has built on its strengths, efforts taken to fix the problems the institution has identified, efforts put forward by the institution to improve quality, and also the future plans for improving quality at the institution. Every institution stakeholder should be kept fully informed and actively participating in the self-study. The institution's head must take a leading part in attaining the goals of self-evaluation. A steering committee with 4 to 6 members can be established to help him or her by organizing the collection and analysis of data. This committee can be in charge of compiling information and data in creating a thorough SSR. The structure of the SSR to be submitted to NAAC should include a preface, an executive summary, profile of the institution, profile of the institution, criteria wise report and inputs from each department of the institution. Clarity issues could arise from a long, dense SSR that has excessive details and descriptions. A report of this nature would also be unfocused and produce more information gaps than explanations. The resource person also mentioned that the SSR should not exceed more than 200 pages, should be single line spaced, should be A4 size, should be both sides printing with font size 12 of 'Times New Roman' and one and half inch's margin on each side of the page. With a reminder about the seriousness and importance of assessment criteria, the resource person winded up the session.

The second session on 'Annual Quality Assurance Report' or AQAR was carried out by the Dr. Usha Nair. Annual Quality Assurance Report, a reporting document, provides a thorough evaluation of all the accomplishments and actions taken by the institution over a given academic year. AQAR offers precise information on the development and effectiveness of HEIs at both the academic and non-academic levels. The AQAR Report for Colleges and Higher Education Institutions contributes to the accurate information about the institution's growth in accordance with the seven essential NAAC criteria. The report is helpful in highlighting the activities and actions the institute executed in order to grow and thrive. The 7 AQAR criterions includes curricular aspects (Criterion 1), teaching-learning and evaluation (Criterion 2), research, innovation and extensions (Criterion 3), infrastructure and learning resources (Criterion 4), student support and progression (Criterion 5), governance leadership and management (Criterion 6), institutional values and best practices (Criterion 7). Each criterion has several sub-criteria to be fulfilled by the institution. The resource person discussed



on each criterion and emphasized the importance of AQAR in NAAC assessment and accreditation process.

The programme on 'Preparation of SSR and AQAR' conducted as part of Professional Development Programme (PDP) was extremely fruitful. The faculty members could enhance their knowledge base and competence. All the faculty members participated in the programme indicated positive feedback and suggested that they were interested in participating in more such fruitful and informative programmes.

The presidential address by the principal-in-Charge was succeeded by the inaugural ceremony of the programme. Dr. Sibichen Kalarikkal, the President of All Kerala Training College Teachers Association (AKTCTA) officially inaugurated the programme and delivered the inaugural address. Dr. Sibichen Kalarikkal began by congratulating the programme coordinators and all the faculty members who cooperated in making this programme happen. He raised a question against the participants that whether they are providing service and whether they are aware of the benefits they shall gain for the services they are providing. He also pointed out the states' inefficiency in delivering the benefits to the service providers on time. He emphasized that all of the service providers must be aware of their benefits and shall reap them.

He pointed out that even people who are highly service minded especially teachers are often unaware of the benefits they should receive in that field of service. He emphasized that all of the faculty members being service providers under Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam must inform themselves about the regulations, Acts and Statutes of the University. Then, Dr. A.S Sumesh carried out a visual presentation on 'University and Service Rules'. In the presentation, he explained about the Act and Statutes of University. The Syndicate which is the sovereign council of university has the complete authority to construct, make necessary amendments and remove any of the university statutes with the Governor's Permission. Whereas the University Act is something on which a governing body of the university does not have any authority. The government legislature has the authority to pass, amend and remove University Acts. The presentation also covered various University Acts in Kerala including the legislatural University Act (1971), Kerala University Act (1974), Calicut University Acts (1975).



Act (1975), Mahatma Gandhi University Act (1985), Cochin University of Science and Technology Act (1986), Sree Sankaracharya University of Sanskrit Act (1994), Kannur University Act (1996) and Thunchathu Ezhuthachan Malayalam University Act (2013). Then the resource person did a comparison of these University Acts. After that the session moved on to the Mahatma Gandhi University Act which since the webinar is organized for faculty and staff members from institutions affiliated to Mahatma Gandhi University Kottayam. The Mahatma Gandhi University Act, 1985 had VIII chapters and 102 sections until chapter IX namely 'Autonomous Colleges' and its sections has been added to the Act Recently. At present, The Mahatma Gandhi University Act have IX chapters and 121 sections. The chapter VIII of the University Act namely, 'Private Colleges and Affiliation to Colleges' which is of utmost importance was discussed in the webinar. All of the sections in chapter VIII were discussed in detail. After that, various parts, chapters and sections of Kerala Service Rules were discussed. Areas like pay, additions to pay, leave including casual leave, special casual leave, joining time, HRA (House Rent Allowance), assessment process and important government orders were covered in the presentation. The UGC Regulations 2010 and its amendments were explained by the resource person. After the presentation session, a question-and-answer session was conducted for the participants to clarify their doubts.

After the session, Dr. Josephine Joseph, IQAC Coordinator and Assistant Professor in Physical Science Education delivered the vote of thanks for the programme. 
