Programme Report

St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam and Council for Teacher Education Foundation (CTEF), Kerala State Centre jointly organized a Faculty Development Programme: Panel Discussion on 'New Trends in Teacher Education' on 6th of May 2023 from 10 AM to 1 PM at the seminar hall at the TTC block at the college. The discussion was organized with the aim of enhancing the awareness regarding various upcoming trends in education and to share the opinions and suggestions in relation to NEP 2020. Dr. V.M. Sasikumar, Patron of the CTEF (Council for Teacher Education Foundation), South Zone was

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the chief guest for the panel discussion. The faculty coordinator of the programme was Dr. Joby Joy Kurian, Assistant Professor in Mathematics Education at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam. A total of 26 participants including faculty members, research scholars and other dignitaries from various institutions in India.

The panel discussion programme started exactly at 10 AM with a prayer song by Dr. Joby Joy Kurian, Assistant Professor in Mathematics Education at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam. The prayer was succeeded by the welcome address for the programme. The welcome speech for the programme was delivered by Dr. Alice Joseph, Principal at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam, Dr. Alice Joseph officially welcomed all the dignitaries and participants to the panel discussion. The welcome speech was succeeded by the presidential address for the discussion delivered by Dr. Grace Annie Mathews, Chairperson of CTEF (Council for Teacher Education Foundation). Dr. Grace Annie Mathews pointed out the inevitability to implement new trends such as problem-based projects and socially oriented projects. Dr. Grace Annie Mathews indicated the importance to develop copability along with capability. After the presidential address was the inauguration of the panel discussion programme. The programme was inaugurated by Dr. V.M Sasikumar, Patron of the CTEF (Council for Teacher Education Foundation), South Zone. During the inaugural address, Dr. V.M Sasikumar provided an overview and functioning of CTEF (Council for Teacher Education Foundation) and also mentioned about some of the former delegates. Dr. V.M Sasikumar mentioned that CTEF (Council for Teacher Education Foundation) is in its 25th year and he also pointed out that CTEF aims at empowerment. The inaugural address was succeeded by the felicitation of the event delivered by Dr. Anil Kumar K.P, Principal at Devaki Amma Memorial Teacher Education College at Chelambra, Malappuram. Dr. Anil Kumar K.P commented on the present scenario of teacher education existing in Kerala. He also shared his expectations in the discipline. After the felicitation, Prof. Geetha Janet Vitus, Dean and Faculty of Education, Department of Education, University of Kerala, elucidated new trends in tune with NEP 2020. Prof. Geetha Janet Vitus expressed her anguish over the future of D.El.Ed course, the status of the teacher education programme and the plight of stand-alone teacher education colleges in Kerala. She also recommended experiential learning, mastery-based grading, and the relevance of the practice of mindfulness as the new trends in education.

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Followed by the keynote address, the panel discussion started exactly at 11 AM. The

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moderator for the panel discussion was Dr. V Reghu, Former Dean and Controller of Examinations, Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development at Sriperumbadur, Tamil Nadu. The panelists who carried out panel presentations were Dr. K. Anvar, principal at CPAS, College of Teacher Education in Thottakkal; Dr. Saramma Chandy, Former Principal at The Lords Universal College of Education, Mumbai University; and Dr. Madhubala Jayachandran, Principal at Acharya Teachers Training College, Kerala Hindi Prachar Sabha, Trivandrum. After a short introduction by the moderator, the discussion was initiated by Dr. Saramma Chandy and her opinion was that action matters more than theory. According to her, the teacher education ecosystem has to be remolded and her focus point was the need to develop humanization through teacher education. After that, Dr. Madhubala Jayachandran brought attention to NEP and Integrated Teacher Education Programme. Dr. Madhubala Jayachandran restated copability and capability. After that, Dr. K. Anvar, cited the state of Orissa as a role model for the teacher education programme. He put forward the idea of a pilot trial before implementing new trends under the supervision of an apex body consisting of expert academicians. Dr. K. Anvar stated that governments were responsible to address the basic problems and malpractices in the area of teacher education. Followed by the panel presentations, the discussion was initiated by Dr. M.S Geetha, Former Dean and Faculty of Education at University of Kerala and Former Principal at GCTE (Government College of Teacher Education), Trivandrum. Dr. M.S Geetha addressed two main issues, the future of stand-alone teacher education institutions and the status and privilege of teacher educators. She also mentioned the areas prepared to submit to the higher education council and government to revisit to make an amendment. After that, Dr. T.K Mathew, Principal at Mar Thoma Teachers Training College, Ranny; Dr. G Valsala, Principal at BNV College of Teacher Education in Tiruvallour, Trivandrum; Dr. T Kerala Sreemathi, Senior Research Officer (Retd.) at SCERT (The State Council of Education Research and Training), Trivandrum; Dr. Mariamma Mathew, Principal at Peet Memorial Training College, Mavelikara; and Dr. Premachandran P, Assistant Professor in Physical Science at Navajyothi College of Teacher Education for Women, Olarikkara in Trissur, participated in the discussion and expressed their opinion and anxieties on the implementation of NEP 2020. After the discussions, the programme came to an end at 12 PM with the vote of thanks delivered by Prof. Dr. Rajeswari K, General Secretary at CTEF (Council of Teacher Education Foundation) in Kerala. A general body meeting was conducted after the session and the meeting winded up by 1 PM.

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The entire panel discussion programme turned out to be successful in achieving its objectives. The program could enhance the awareness of the faculty members and research scholars regarding various upcoming trends in education and to share the opinions and suggestions in relation to NEP 2020. 




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Programme Report

The inaugural meeting of the international virtual conference on Nuances in Social Science Research Methodology, Academic Writing, and Reference Management: An **Exploration** was an impressive gathering of distinguished academicians. Sr. Dr. Alice Joseph, Principal of St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam, set the tone with a warm welcome address. Presiding over the meeting was Dr. Rajan Varughese, Member Secretary of The Kerala State Higher Education Council, who highlighted the significance of the conference's theme in the current academic landscape. 


Day 2 Schedule and Report (April 18, 2023)

Forenoon Theme Sessions (Session 1: 09:30 AM - 11:00 AM; Session 2: 11:10 AM - 12:40 PM)

On the 2nd day of the conference, the forenoon theme sessions were handled by Dr. Johnson Jament. He delivered a comprehensive lecture encompassing two fundamental themes in academic research: "Methodological Foundations of the Research Process" and "Inclusive Research." He commenced with an exploration of the research process, elaborating on its stages – from the formulation of a research question, literature review, and methodology selection to data collection, analysis, interpretation, and eventually, reporting the results. Dr. Jament underscored the importance of choosing a methodological approach congruent with the research question and emphasized the role of scientific rigor and ethical considerations in all stages of the process. Shifting focus to "Inclusive Research," he advocated for participatory research paradigms that promote the active involvement of marginalized and underrepresented groups in the research process, both as subjects and co-creators of knowledge. He elucidated that inclusive research not only facilitates more equitable research practices but also enriches academic inquiries by incorporating diverse perspectives.


The afternoon session was for presenting papers. Faculty members, research scholars, and postgraduate students were divided into 10 Zoom rooms.

Forenoon Theme Sessions (Session 1: 09:30 AM - 11:00 AM; Session 2: 11:10 AM - 12:40 PM)


In the forenoon theme session, Mr. V Sriram conducted an insightful lecture on "Menace of Plagiarism in the Era of AI: How to be on the Safer Side?" and "Significance and Challenges of Reference Management and Open-Source Tools (Zotero)." In the first part of his lecture, he outlined the rising threat of plagiarism in the age of artificial intelligence (AI), emphasizing how easy access to vast online information and AI-driven paraphrasing tools can inadvertently lead to plagiarism. He suggested strategies to avoid this pitfall, including rigorous citation practices, utilising plagiarism detection software, and nurturing a strong understanding of the concept and consequences of plagiarism. Transitioning to reference management, Mr. Sriram illuminated the significance of effective reference management in maintaining the integrity and quality of academic work. He outlined the challenges researchers face, such as keeping track of numerous sources and citing them correctly. He then introduced open-source tool Zotero that can help in overcoming these challenges. By effectively managing and automating citations, Zotero not only simplifies the referencing process but also significantly reduces the likelihood of errors or accidental plagiarism. Overall, Mr. Sriram's lecture provided practical advice on navigating contemporary challenges in academic writing and reference management. The afternoon session was for presenting papers. Faculty members, research scholars, and postgraduate students were divided into 4 Zoom rooms.


Inauguration


Day One Report (December 3, 2022)

By unraveling the complexities of the publishing world, Dr. Vijayakumar armed the attendees with crucial knowledge to enhance their research dissemination efforts. His discourse represented an invaluable resource for researchers striving to make informed decisions regarding their publication endeavors.



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Day Two Report (December 4, 2022)

He also touched on the various models of peer review, such as single-blind, double-blind, and open peer review. 


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Day Three Report (December 5, 2022)

Day Four Report (December 6, 2022)





The programme was organized for the non-teaching staff members of St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam.



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The major purpose of organizing the programme was to enhance the knowledge and competence of the staff members and help them acquire specific skills to perform well in their duties and thereby promote productivity and effective functioning of the institution. Jincy Joseph, UGC Librarian and Rincy V.D, LD Computer Assistant at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam were the coordinators of the programme. The resource person was Mr. Eldho Kuriakose, Assistant professor and Head of the Department of Commerce at St. Peter's College in Kolenchery, Kerala. A total of 8 non – teaching staff from St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam participated in the programme.

The programme on 'Advanced MS Excel for Office' started exactly at 10.00 AM at the college ICT lab. The programme began with prayer. Ms. Rincy V.D officially welcomed all of the participants. The presidential address for the programme was delivered by Dr. Alice Joseph, Principal at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women. Dr. Alice Joseph enunciated the relevance of the topic for the programme, 'Advanced MS Excel for Office'. She explained that the present topic would contribute to the enhancement of the knowledge and skills of the staff members. The knowledge they receive via the programme would help them to excel in their administrative duties and tasks which would then enhance the efficiency and effective functioning of the entire institution. Thus, both the non – teaching staff and the institution will be benefitted from the programme. Dr. Alice Joseph reminded all of the staff members to utilize the programme effectively. After the presidential address delivered by the principal, the session was started by the resource person, Mr. Eldho Kuriakose. The resource person started the session with the explanation on basic MS Excel and the advanced MS Excel and the difference between these two. The MS Excel is a widely used spreadsheet programme. A software programme called Microsoft Excel was created by Microsoft. It mostly consists of tabs, command groups, and spreadsheets. It keeps the data in tabulated form and gives users the option to manipulate it. It is an office use application created by Microsoft. Other Microsoft programmes including PowerPoint, Word, Outlook, Access, and OneNote are included in the Office Suite. Both the Windows and the Mac operating systems support it. Microsoft Excel is one among the best spreadsheet tools for storing and representing data in a tabular format, managing and manipulating data, creating charts using optical logic, and more. Excel gives a worksheet to create a new document. The Excel file can be saved with the xls extension. The



excel spreadsheet has several features which will make users tasks more manageable. The major features include, auto format, auto sum, list auto fill, auto fill, auto shapes, wizard, charts, pivot table and shortcut menus.

Advanced Excel 'Functions' refers to the tools and capabilities of Microsoft Excel that enable users to carry out complex computations, analyze the data, and do a lot more. Some of the advanced excel functions include goal seek, what-if analysis with solver, If- Else, If- Error, pivot tables, excel VBA, index and match and offset function. With the help of the built-in Goal Seek function in Advanced Excel Functions, users can modify the assumptions to obtain the desired result. The procedure relies on the trial-and-error approach to produce the desired outcome. What-if analysis is a technique used in Advanced Excel that involves modifying the values to test out various situations for calculations. Some or all of these Advanced Excel calculations can employ numerous alternative sets of values to experiment with various results. The best tool for what-if analysis is a solver. It is a Microsoft Excel add-in tool and is beneficial on numerous levels. In the cell referred to as the objective cell, the feature can be utilized to determine the best value for a formula. However, some restrictions or limitations apply to the values of other formula cell formulas on a worksheet. The formulations in the constraint and objective cells are computed by the solver using a set of cells called decision variables. Whatif analysis in advanced excel is the process of altering data to test out various situations for calculations. One or more of these can employ several various sets of values. When working with constraint cell limitations, the solver modifies the values of decision variable cells. The objective cell's desired outcome can be ascertained using this procedure. When a condition is tested using the If-Else function, a value is returned if the condition is found to be true and a different value, if it is found to be false. When a formula produces an error, the Excel If Error function returns an alternative result; otherwise, it returns the expected result. A pivot table is another function of advanced excel. In essence, a pivot table is an Excel data summarizing tool that enables users to quickly report on and investigate trends based on information. Using the drag and drop functionality of the pivot table and the appropriate functions inside, users may create section-wise summaries. Excel VBS or Excel Visual Basic Analysis. Microsoft's eventdriven scripting language for Office programme is Excel VBA. Most people who develop VBA code do so by using macros. Another advanced excel function is index and match. The index function will return a specific value that is existent in a uni-dimensional range, whereas the match function returns the position of a value within a given range.



The programme on, 'Advanced MS Excel for Office', was extremely fruitful. The

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participants could enhance their knowledge base and competence in the area of technical administration duties. 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



The IQAC Cell of St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam organized Professional Development Programme on 'Curriculum Mapping' on 3rd and 4th November 2022 from 9.00 AM to 4.00 PM at the college multipurpose hall. The programme was organized for the faculty members of St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam. The faculty coordinators of the programme were Dr. Josephine Joseph, IQAC Coordinator and Assistant Professor in Physical Science Education and Rosy Tintu M.P., Assistant Professor in Physical Science Education at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam. The resource person for the programme was Mr. Deepak Babu, Assistant Professor in Department of Business Management at Rajagiri College of Social Sciences (Autonomous), Kalamassery in Kochi. A total of 18 faculty members from St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam participated in the programme.

The two-day FDP on 'Curriculum Mapping' started exactly at 9.00 AM at the college multipurpose hall on 3rd November 2022. Dr. Marin Jose, Assistant Professor in English Education at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam performed emcee for the entire programme. The programme began with a prayer song by Dr. Joby Joy Kurian, Assistant Professor in Mathematics Education at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam. The prayer was succeeded by the welcome speech delivered by Dr. Josephine Joseph, Assistant Professor in Physical Science Education at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam. Dr. Josephine Joseph officially welcomed the resource person and all the participants. She reminded all of the faculty members to utilize the opportunity to enhance their knowledge and competence which would reflect their excellence in their functioning area of the profession. After the welcome address, the programme was initiated by the resource person, Mr. Deepak Babu. The resource person started with discussion about outcome-based education. Outcome based education is an approach to education in which all decisions on teaching and learning are driven by what the educator want his learners to be able to do at the end of a learning experience. The meaning of outcome-based education is that desired outcomes form the basis for the entire learning system. An outcomebased curriculum is designed with the outcomes in mind right at its conception.



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The course content and assessments are developed based on the outcome itself. The outcomes of a programme define its aims and directions. In order for the programme to be truly outcome-based, the curriculum, pedagogy, and evaluation should all contribute to the achievement of this particular set of goals. Curriculum mapping serves as an instrument for determining how far this has been achieved. The resource person also discussed about the advantages of outcome-based education which includes clarity, provision of a framework, guide for assessment and facilitating curriculum evaluation. The resource person through PowerPoint presentation clearly depicted and explained on the framework of outcome-based education. The framework for outcome-based education encompasses a vision and mission, Program Educational Objectives (PEO's), Program Outcomes and Program Specific Outcomes (PO's and PSO's). A mission statement or simply a mission is a public declaration that educational institutions use to describe their founding purpose and major organizational commitments. Program Educational Objectives or PEO's are statements that describe the career and professional accomplishments that the program is preparing the graduates to achieve. They are set in order to measure the effectiveness of the program and to check whether it has prepared the students to deal with the real world where they could apply and use the skills and knowledge they have acquired to good use. Program Objectives or PO's are statements about the knowledge, skills and attitudes or attributes that graduate of a forma program should possess. Program Outcomes deals with the general aspect of graduation for a particular program and the competencies and expertise a graduate will possess after completion of that program. The resource person also explained on how course objectives and course outcomes of a particular course is set. The FDP also covered blooms taxonomy. Bloom's Taxonomy is a hierarchical categorization of thinking levels that should be used when developing course objectives. Course objectives are concise statements that outline what students should know by the conclusion of the course.

The resource person discussed about curriculum mapping and its purpose. Mapping is done to measure the outcomes. Curriculum mapping is a reflective technique that assists teachers in understanding what was taught in class, how it was taught, and how learning objectives were assessed. A curriculum map is the output of the curriculum mapping process. The majority of curriculum maps usually are graphical representations of tables or matrices. A comprehensive curriculum map enables teachers to examine and present teaching that has been successfully implemented, either by themselves or by others. Curriculum maps may additionally be utilized as a tool for planning future instruction. Curriculum mapping, in

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addition to helping with reflective practice and improved communication among faculty members, it serves to improve overall consistency from grade to grade, increasing the possibility of accomplishing program- or performance in the classroom. The resource person also discussed about systematic curriculum mapping. Although a single teacher can certainly build a curriculum mapping for the particular subject and grade level they teach, curriculum mapping is the most effective when it's a system-wide approach. Outcome based education and its framework is very important to work with curriculum mapping. The resource reminded all of the faculty members about the components in the framework of outcome-based education which are important for curriculum mapping. At the end of the session, the faculty members were given assignments to work on curriculum mapping for the very next day. After the session, Rosy Tintu M.P, programme coordinator for the programme and Assistant Professor in Physical Science Education at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam, delivered the vote of thanks for the programme. The entire session conducted on 3rd November 2022 winded up at 4.00 PM.

On 4th November 2022, the faculty members who attended the programme on curriculum mapping worked on the assignments given during the workshop. The faculty members prepared specific Program Educational Objectives (PEO's) and Course Educational Objectives (CEO's) for all the courses with the training they received. 

The resource person started with explaining about community resource. The terminology 'community resource' refers to a broad range of elements that could be beneficial to the community. As long as it offers aid or service to the local residents, it could be anything. Community resources includes people, things, places and activities. These could be international businesses, associations, government agencies, or even people in the community. Many sources of funding are available for community resources. They may be operated by entirely nonprofit organizations, as well as by the government, corporations, or a single individual. While historically these resources referred to particular support groups, nonprofits, or outreach organizations, they now cover a larger variety of things. There are countless different kinds of community resources. Of course, anyone might mention a few off the top of their minds that have become more established and well-known. Yet as far as something is assisting a community, a minor part of it or even one single person, that thing or person serves as a part of community resources. The resource person also discussed on the significance of the community resources in education. Community Resources for a community are the ones that improve or make the lives of individuals better. Every person's development requires these resources in some form. Factories, schools, theatres, libraries, houses of worship, hospitals, community centers, parks, etc. are a few examples of community resources. Using these resources in teaching would be wise because it fosters a sense of worth and camaraderie among pupils. Students' learning experiences can be strengthened when educators use community



resources while teaching. Students will have the opportunity to learn in the real world owing to their understanding of the local community. It broadens students' horizons of knowledge and aids in their comprehension of how various community institutions operate. It encourages people to act responsibly and take the initiative to make improvements to the society in which they live. Also, it allows students to be exposed to many perspectives and promotes the development of an inclusive and stimulating environment. Community resources could help people learn democratic principles and get a deeper grasp of democracy. Students would feel more in control as a result, and these experiences would aid them in generating creative thoughts.

The resource person also discussed about some of the methods to utilize community resources in education. The methods discussed included, community surveys, community services and excursions. Students can learn about diverse facets of the society in which they live in by participating in community surveys. Students will be exposed to an array of cultures, values, traditions and ideologies. They will be capable of acquiring a great deal of knowledge, information and skills that rote learning will not allow them to get. They would be able to understand a multitude of issues that other communities are having and can discover the causes of these problems. They can also establish links between this information and the concepts they are studying in classroom. Also, these surveys will inform people about the value and significance of education and the forms of transformations that may be made attributable to education. Another technique to improve the teaching and learning process is through community services. It provides exposure to the challenges that are present in the community and gives pupils a concept of the various community resources. With this information, they may take the required steps to rectify the situation and improve situations. Students who participate in community services develop their talents by gaining access to contact with a diverse group of people. It eliminates any preconceptions they may have and can assist in shattering social stereotypes, all of which contribute to the improvement of the community as a whole. Field trips or excursions can provide students with unique learning opportunities. Field trips would expose students to diverse learning opportunities, in contrast to a classroom setting. These excursions may introduce pupils to new values and customs as well as generate new interests in them. Community resources can serve as an information- and experience-rich textbook for education. Instructors can serve as facilitators, making the most out of the available materials, and give students the opportunity to acquire the maximum knowledge possible.



The faculty coordinators of the programme were Dr. Josephine Joseph, IQAC Coordinator and Assistant Professor in Physical Science Education and Ms. Anu Cleetus, Assistant Professor in Education at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam. The resource person for the programme was Mr. Sreekumar Raghavan, Editor of Pallikuttam Magazine at Rajagiri Media in Rajagiri Valley, Kakkanad in Kochi. A total of 17 faculty members from St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam participated in the programme.

The FDP on 'Techniques in Editing Research Articles' started exactly at 8.00 PM via Google Meet. The programme began with a prayer by Ms. Reshmi R.K, Guest Faculty in Physical Science Education at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam. The prayer was succeeded by the welcome speech delivered by Ms. Aswathy D.V, Assistant Professor (M Ed. Faculty) at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam. Ms. Aswathy D.V officially welcomed the resource person and all of the participants to the programme. After the welcome address, the programme was initiated by the resource person, Mr. Sreekumar Raghavan. Through theme presentation, the resource person enunciated the importance of faculty members being aware and acquire expertise in research methodology and various techniques in editing research articles since research is one of the important and inevitable components in the teaching profession. The presentation started with explaining on what exactly is research, its purpose and its reporting format. Research is a systematic inquiry or information gathering and analysis aimed to acquire or contribute to reliable and valid knowledge. Research can also be known as the process of modifying the existing body of knowledge. The careful consideration of studies concerning a particular subject or issue using scientific methods is known as research. The goal of research is to expand knowledge via scientific concepts, theories, and ideas in order to benefit society. Forming assumptions, collecting data, analyzing and interpreting, and so on all contribute to achieving a research goal. Research summarizes the precise topic and goals of the research study, catering the readers with a realistic, precise and clear grasp of the findings. As a process of acquisition or building of knowledge, research inspires and empowers individuals as well as groups to personal and professional growth. The goal of educational research is to generate new knowledge. But, for most educators, the goal is to improve practice while also being guided by theory. Preparing research articles are one



among the major works done by profession educators. Understanding the techniques to edit research articles is essential to improve and ensure quality in the services provided by them. The resource also discussed the format for reporting a research article. The format for research article includes an abstract, an introduction, purpose and objectives, methodology, analysis, discussion of findings, limitations of study and conclusion. An abstract is a brief synopsis or summary of a completed research. Abstracts should be concise and self- sufficient, describing the entire study briefly as feasible. The introduction part of the research provides context for a research study, introduces the topic and objectives, and provides an outline of the study. The purpose and objectives of a research are outcomes that is aimed to attain by conducting research. Developing strong research objectives might assist the researcher in achieving the overall objectives of the research study. The goal of research objectives is to guide the research study which includes guiding in gathering data, analysis and interpretation and conclusions. The objectives must be SMART (Smart, Measurable, Achievable, Relevant and Time Bound). The methodology of research specifies how the researcher aims to conduct the research study. It is the blueprint of the entire research study. It is the procedures or strategies used to gather, process, and analyze information about a topic. Data analysis in research is a method of employing appropriate logical or statistical technique to make meaning out of the raw data collected. Discussion of findings is the final section of a research study in which the researcher summarizes, analyses and make interpretations of the findings. In this part, the researcher would discuss the relevance of the findings and relate everything to the research topic or the research questions they have formulated. Limitation of the study are the challenges or those features of the research design that impacted the interpretations of the research findings. A conclusion of a research study is the synthesis of essential arguments or key points of the study and it helps the reader understand why the particular research is important to them.

After discussion about the format of research study, the resource person demonstrated editing a sample study showing various techniques. Mr. Sreekumar Raghavan enunciated that the necessity of revising a research article after writing it is to ensure that it is appealing and comprehensive for the readers. Good editing can considerably increase the efficacy of the narrative style and the clarity of the work. The editing process ensures that the research article is structured in an orderly manner that communicates the research and that the ideas are conveyed in the most effective way. Editing can be content, copy, line and mechanical. In content editing, the researcher evaluates the arrangement and presentation of the research study. Copy editing involved rectification of punctuation and spelling errors, focus is more on

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grammar and word choices and the researcher would boost his writing quality. In line editing, as the name suggests involves line by line verification of the research study. Focus is given on clarity and simplification in writing so that the meaning is apparent and not overly complicated. In mechanical editing, it is ensured that the research article follow the standards of the chosen research style. Some other techniques shared by the resource person for editing research articles included citation management, formatting, proofreading, making a professional or others to read and review the work so that any missed-out mistakes or points could be rectified or added. Reviewing the entire research article can also enhance its quality. After the session carried out by the resource person, Ms. Sheeba A.S, Assistant Professor (M Ed. Faculty) at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam delivered the vote of thanks for the programme. With that, the entire programme came to an end by 9.00 PM.







E-resources are digital information resources that may be accessed at any time and from any location. These resources are available both online and offline. E-resources includes







The purpose of the programme was to equip teacher educators with knowledge regarding latest trends of education and to enhance their knowledge and skills and thereby promote their professional growth. The faculty coordinator of the programme was Dr. Josephine Joseph, IQAC Coordinator and Assistant Professor in Physical Science Education at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam. The resource person for the programme was Mrs. Gayathri Muralidharan, Faculty of Department of English at The Indian High School, Dubai. A total of 18 faculty members from St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam participated in the programme.

Day 1 (03/08/2022):

The programme on 'Exploring the Dimensions of NEP' started exactly at 11.00 AM on 3rd August 2022 via Zoom. The programme began with an invocation to the Almighty by Dr. Marin Jose, Assistant Professor in English Education at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam. The prayer was succeeded by the welcome address for the programme. The welcome address was delivered by Dr. Josephine Joseph, IQAC Coordinator and Assistant Professor in Physical Science Education. Dr. Josephine Joseph officially welcomed the resource person and all the faculty members. The welcome speech was succeeded by the interactive session handled by the resource person for the day, Mrs. Gayathri Muralidharan. The content delivery was supplemented with PowerPoint presentations. The entire session was divided into two talk sessions. And in between the talk sessions, the participants were provided with opportunity for open discussions.

The resource person enunciated about the trends in modern education. The structure of knowledge is changing rapidly on a global scale. Many unskilled jobs could be replaced by machines due to dramatic technological and scientific advancements like the machine learning, rise of big data and artificial intelligence. As a result, there will be a growing demand for skilled workers with expertise in Computer Science, Mathematics and data science as well as cross-disciplinary skills in the natural and social sciences as well as the humanities. The way people meet the needs of the world for water, food, energy and sanitation will significantly change as



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a result of climate change, rapidly increasing pollution, and the depletion of natural resources. This will once again lead to a need for new skilled workers, particularly in the fields of chemistry, biology, physics, climate science, social science and agriculture. The increasing frequency of pandemics and epidemics will necessitate joint research in managing infectious diseases and vaccine development, and the ensuing socioeconomic challenges will increase the need for interdisciplinary education. As India grows closer to being a developed nation and one of the three greatest economies in the world, there will be a rising demand for arts and humanities. Children must not only study, but more crucially, learn how to learn, given the rapidly changing nature of the labor market and the global environment. Hence, education needs to shift away from teaching knowledge and towards teaching students how to think critically, solve issues, be multidisciplinary and creative, as well as how to adapt, innovate and acquire new information in domains that are evolving. To make education more immersive, comprehensive, integrated, learner-centered, inquiry-driven, discovery-oriented, discussionbased, adaptable, and, of course, fun, pedagogy must change. In addition to mathematics and science, the curriculum must also cover the fundamental of the humanities, games, sports and health, languages, culture, literature and values in order to help students grow in all facets of their learning and to broaden their understanding of the world. Education must help students develop their moral character and help them become ethical, logical, empathetic, and caring people while also preparing them for rewarding careers.

The resource person also discussed about the dimensions of educational policy. The growth of each person's creative potential is emphasized heavily in education policy. It is based on the idea that education must foster the development of not only cognitive abilities—including 'foundational' abilities like literacy and numeracy as well as 'higher- order' abilities like problem-solving and critical thinking—but also of ethical, social and emotional abilities and dispositions. This Policy has been guided by the extensive body of ancient and timeless Indian knowledge and thinking. The highest human purpose has traditionally been seen in Indian thought and ideology as the pursuit of knowledge, truth and wisdom. The purpose of education in ancient India was just not merely to acquire knowledge to prepare for life in this world or life after school, but for the total development of the individual. The objective of schooling in ancient India was the total realization and freedom of the self, not only the accumulation of knowledge to prepare for life on this planet or life after school. The core of the significant changes to the educational system must be the teacher. Because they actually mold our future generation of citizens, the new education strategy must assist in re-establishing

teachers as the most revered and significant individuals in society at all levels. It must take all necessary steps to empower educators and support them as they carry out their duties. By guaranteeing a living wage, respect, autonomy and dignity, the new education policy shall assist in attracting the absolute best and brightest to the profession of teaching at all levels. The new education strategy must offer a high-quality education to all pupils, regardless of their place of residence, with a focus on traditionally disadvantaged, underprivileged, and marginalized populations. The best means of attaining equality, inclusiveness, and social and economic mobility are through education since it levels the playing field. A variety of targeted chances to enter and succeed in the education systems must be provided for all students from these groups, notwithstanding inherent barriers. The country's regional and global demands, along with its rich culture and diversity, must be respected and honored while incorporating these components. In order to foster national pride, self-knowledge, self-confidence, cooperation, and integration, it is thought crucial to educate India's youth about the country's diverse cultural, social and technological demands as well as its unique artistic, linguistic, and knowledge heritage. The session for day 1 winded up at 12.30 PM with the vote of thanks delivered by Dr. Alice Joseph, Principal at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam.

Day 2 (04/08/2022):

The second day of the programme started at 11.00 AM on 4th August 2022 via Zoom. The programme began with a prayer song by Dr. Joby Joy Kurian, Assistant Professor in Mathematics Education at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam. In the second day also, the entire session was divided in to two talk sessions and in between the sessions, open discussion was conducted which provided opportunities for participating faculty members in the programme to express their ideas and opinions.

The theme for the day 2 of the workshop was 'Learning should be holistic, integrated, enjoyable and engaging'. The talk session was carried out by Ms. Anu Cleetus, Assistant Professor in Education at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam. Ms. Anu Cleetus discussed about the overall curriculum and pedagogy reforms across education systems. The main goal of all stages of curriculum and pedagogy reform will be to shift away from the culture of rote learning that is prevalent today and towards actual understanding and learning how to learn. The goal of education will be to enhance students' cognitive abilities as well as their character and create whole, well-rounded people who possess the essential 21st century skills. In the end, education aids in the manifestation of knowledge



as the perfection that is already ingrained in a person. To achieve these important objectives, the entire curriculum and pedagogy will be reoriented and overhauled. At every learning stage, from preschool through higher education, specific sets of values and skills will be recognized for integration and absorption. The development of curriculum frameworks and transactional mechanisms will make sure that these values and skills are inculcated through enjoyable teaching and learning activities. The National Curriculum Framework for early childhood and school education would have mechanisms for the transaction of these necessary skill sets identified and included by NCERT. Each subject's curriculum will be narrowed down to the essentials in order to make room for critical thinking and more comprehensive, inquiry-based, discussion-based, discovery- based and analysis-based learning. Important concepts, applications, ideas and problem solving will be the focus of the required content. Questions will be welcomed, and class sessions will frequently include more enjoyable, collaborative, creative and exploratory activities that allow pupils to engage in deeper and more immersive learning. Teaching and learning will be performed in a more interactive learning environment. Experiential learning will be implemented at all levels, with explorations of the connections between various subjects as well as hands-on learning, education that incorporates the arts and sports, and pedagogy centered on telling stories, among others, as normal practices within each subject. Classroom activities will change to competency-based learning and teaching to address the gap in achievement of learning outcomes. Also, the assessment instruments-including assessment 'as', 'of', and 'for' learning will be in line with the learning objectives, skills, and perspectives that are listed for each subject in a specific class. A cross-curricular educational strategy known as art-integration uses diverse facets and expressions of culture and art as the foundation for the understanding of concepts in a variety of courses. As a part of the emphasis on experiential education and art-integrated learning will be incorporated into classroom activities in order to not only foster a positive learning environment but also to impart the Indian ethos by incorporating Indian culture and art into all aspects of teaching and learning. The connections between culture and education will be strengthened by this art-integrated strategy.

Another cross-curricular educational strategy is sports integration, which incorporates physical activities, including indigenous sports, into classroom activities to help students learn skills like cooperation, self-direction, self-initiative, self-discipline, responsibility, teamwork, citizenship, etc. In order to help students develop fitness as a lifetime attitude and to accomplish the levels of fitness envisioned by the Fit India Movement, sports-integrated education will be

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


implemented in classroom activities. Sports help to support holistic development by improving both mental and physical well-being while also boosting cognitive capacities, therefore there is a clear necessity to incorporate them into education and empower students by offering them a variety of academic options. Each student have intrinsic skills that must be identified, nourished, and developed. These abilities might manifest as a variety of hobbies, temperaments, and capacities. Students who demonstrate unusually keen interests and aptitudes in a particular field must be encouraged to explore that field outside of the scope of the regular school curriculum. Techniques for identifying and encouraging such student abilities and interests will be included in teacher education programmes. A set of guidelines for the education of brilliant children will be created by the NCERT and NCTE. The education of gifted children may be a specialty that is available through B.Ed. programmes. By providing them with extra enrichment materials, advice, and encouragement, teachers hope to support pupils in the classroom who have unique interests or abilities. Clubs and Circles that are topicand project-based will be promoted and supported at the levels of schools, school complexes, districts, and above. Math circles, science circles, chess circles, music and dance performance circles, language circles, poetry circles, drama circles, sports circles, debate circles, eco-clubs, health and wellness clubs, yoga clubs, and so on are some examples. In keeping with this, highquality national residential summer programmes for secondary school students in a variety of subjects will also be promoted, with a strict merit-based but fair admissions process to draw the best instructors and students from across the nation, including from socioeconomically disadvantaged groups. After the session, feedbacks were collected from the participants. The participants gave positive feedback on the programme. The session winded up at 12.30 PM with the vote of thanks delivered by Dr. Alice Joseph, Principal at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam.




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

Programme Report

The IQAC of St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam organized PDP on 'Emerging Trends in Social Science Research and Data Analysis', on 24th June 2022 from 9.00 AM to 4.00 PM at the M.Ed. seminar hall in the college. The Programme organized for the faculty members of St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam. The faculty coordinators of the programme were Dr. Josephine Joseph, IQAC Coordinator and Assistant Professor in Physical Science Education and Dr. Siji John, Assistant Professor in Social Science Education at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women,

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Professor at Gandhigram Rural Institute in Gandhigram, India. A total of 18 faculty members from St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam participated in the programme.

The Programme on 'Emerging Trends in Social Science Research and Data Analysis' conducted as part of Professional Development Programme (PDP) started exactly at 9.00 AM at the M.Ed. seminar hall in the college. The programme started with a prayer. The prayer was succeeded by the welcome speech for the programme. Dr. Josephine Joseph, IQAC Coordinator and Assistant Professor in Physical Science Education at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam delivered the welcome address. After the welcome address delivered by Dr. Josephine Joseph, the resource person Dr. M.A Sudhir, carried out the session on emerging trends in Social Science research and analysis. The resource person started explaining about science and research. He questioned the participants what exactly is science. Science is the systematic body of knowledge. It involves physical science, social science, management science, natural science, life science etc. Research is the systematic inquiry or modification or extension of the existing body of knowledge. Then the resource person shifted to social science and the emerging trends in social science research. Social science is a major field that examines how groups of people interact within a community and other aspects of society. The resource person discussed about the two major types of empirical social research design which includes qualitative research and quantitative research methods. In general, quantitative research tests hypotheses to understand the causal or correlational link between variables, whereas qualitative research uses interviews and observation to understand a phenomenon in its real-world setting. The resource person also explained the formal social research process. The formal social research process involves identification of a research problem or the research gap, review of literature, purpose of the research, determining specific research questions, formulation of hypotheses, selection of suitable methodology, data collection, analyzing and interpretation of data, reporting and assessment of the results and finally communicating the research findings, recommendations and scope for further research.

Social sciences have recently transcended barriers to integrate itself into many fields. Lack of understanding of data, its various typologies, and how each system is supposed to be handled distinctly in data analytics, bias and sampling errors, fixation on computer outputs—wrongly interpreting analytical results, such as results of hypothesis tests—and insufficient training of enumerators or pilot studies are a few issues that are of growing concern in research

practice. Modern social science research puts more emphasis on interdisciplinary and collaborative research, technology- assisted empirical research, relatively shorter research duration in the era of 'big data', as well as the reliability and accuracy of research reports, among other factors. The experienced practitioner and the aspiring researcher should be motivated by all of these dynamics to produce more focused, high-quality research on a consistent basis for the benefit of everyone's well-being, prosperity, and advancement. The resource person also discussed about research data analysis. Researchers utilize research data analysis as a method to distil data into a narrative and then interpret it to draw conclusions. It is logical that the data analysis process aids in breaking up enormous amounts of data into smaller fragments. Every type of data has the unique property of describing objects after being assigned a specific value.

Data can be different types including qualitative, quantitative and categorical data. There are several techniques to analyze each type of data in research. In qualitative research, some commonly used data analysis methods include content analysis, narrative analysis, Discourse analysis and grounded theory. Content analysis can be used to analyze documented information derived from text, photographs, and, in some cases, physical items. Narrative analysis method is used to analyze data acquired from a variety of sources, including personal interviews, field observations, and surveys. The majority of the time, people's stories or opinions are centered on finding solutions to research inquiries. Discourse analysis, like narrative analysis, is used for analyzing human interactions. Nonetheless, this method takes into account the social context in which the conversation between the researcher and respondent takes place. Furthermore, before drawing any conclusions, discourse analysis considers the lifestyle and day-to-day environment. Grounded theory is used to investigate data from a variety of similar cases that occur in various settings. When researchers use this strategy, they may change or create new explanations until they reach a conclusion. Data analysis methods used in quantitative research includes descriptive statistics and inferential statistics. Although descriptive analysis often provides absolute figures, it is never adequate to illustrate the reasoning behind those statistics. Nonetheless, it is vital to consider the optimal research and data analysis strategy for the survey questionnaire and the story researchers would like to tell. Inferential statistics are used to generate predictions about a larger population following a research study and data analysis of the representing population's collected sample. The resource person also discussed about various methods of data analysis like ANOVA testing, regression analysis correlational analysis, cross tabulation and so on. He also explained about SPSS. SPSS or Statistical Package for the Social Sciences, also known as IBM SPSS Statistics

is a software package used for the analysis of statistical data. SPSS is a popular tool for research, experimentation and decision making. It is one of the most widely used statistical software worldwide for its attractive features. The session winded up at 4.00 PM with the vote of thanks delivered by Dr. Siji John, Assistant Professor in Social Science Education at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam.


