Dr Siji John said that Strategies like Cooperative learning, project method, brain storming, buzz session, thank pair share strategy experiential learning Should be encouraged more than sample lecture and demonstration methods for delivering the Curriculum. A wide range of capacity enhancement peogrammes for student leachers need to be planned was brought to the notice of the members by Dr Josephine Joseph. Activities organised other than what is prescribed in the curriculum could be on the online mode. De Marin Jose opined that the Google Class Rooms D space in the library could be utilised for uploading notes and assignments and Students could be encouraged to use the same

The number of Students progressing to Higher Education was found to be very low when compared to Arts and Science Colleges was brought to the notice of the members. One of the reason being that most of them join for B. Ed after having Completed their P.G. Another Reason being that Student teachers were found lacking in being self responsible for learning. Dr Smitha Jose spoke of encouraging Self segulated modes too to enculcate on students atherest for

lifelong learning

AxI Integration on Pedagogy was found to be poor among student teachers. Though workshop on Theater Arts was organised every year yet the outcome of having Art integrated lessons was poor. Dr. Bridu Joseph Suggested that Student teachers must be trained in integrating art into pedagogy and due emphasis must be given for the same by the optional teachers. Dr Smitha Jose opined and call on the same sesource person for the workshop on Yoga, Dagma and Ast and Documentary film making

- 2. Dr Josephone Joseph and Aswathy DV scheduled the syllabus and Submitted it to the Perncipal on 25/05/2022.
