**ST. JOSEPH COLLEGE OF TEACHER EDUCATION FOR WOMEN, ERNAKULAM**, a minority institution, established in 1957 located at Kochi, owned and run by Vimala Province of the Congregation of Mother of Carmel (CMC), affiliated to Mahatma Gandhi university, Kottayam, Kerala and included in the list of colleges maintained under section 2 (f) & 12 (B) of the UGC Act, 1956, offering B.Ed & M.Ed Programme as per the NCTE, hereby establish a Memorandum of Understanding with **RANI MATHA PUBLIC SCHOOL, FLOWER JN. JEWS STREET, KOCHI, KERALA**, with regard to the Induction & Internship Program hereafter (Program) facilitating the (RANI MATHA PUBLIC SCHOOL, FLOWER JN. JEWS STREET, KOCHI, KERALA) acceptance of SJCTEW student teacher's as interns. The terms of the Program are as specified below.

### **Purpose**

Item 1: With a view to training student teachers with the skills and knowledge necessary to serve as efficient and proficient teachers, SJCTEW has established an internship program with the **RANI MATHA PUBLIC SCHOOL, FLOWER JN. JEWS STREET, KOCHI, KERALA**, that will further the individual student teacher's education and develop the practical skills he or she will need for her future career.

### **Period of internship**

Item 2: The period to be engaged in by the student teacher is to be one month for the induction and four months for the internship

### **Content**

Item 3: The content of the Program and the manner in which the student teacher will be assigned is to be determined through consultation among all three parties (the school, SJCTEW and the student teacher).

### **Assigning the internship supervisor**

Item 4: The student's internship supervisor at the school is determined by the **Sr. Jeslin Abraham** (Headmistress, Rani Matha Public School, Flower Jn, Jews Street, Kochi, Kerala)

### **Conditions of the internship**

Item 5: The internship supervisor undertakes to report back to SJCTEW on the student teacher's progress over the course of the Program. The student's faculty supervisor at SJCTEW is to monitor the student teacher's progress in terms of how the Program fulfils her training goals. To this end, the faculty supervisor undertakes to visit the student at least once at the **RANI MATHA PUBLIC SCHOOL, FLOWER JN. JEWS STREET, KOCHI, KERALA**, during Induction and at least three times during the internship period in order to directly observe the student teacher's progress.

### **Evaluation**

Item 6:

The internship supervisor and SJCTEW faculty supervisor are to submit evaluative reports to SJCTEW based upon their observations of the student teacher's performance over the period of her induction and internship.

### **Expenses**

Item 7: The expenses for teaching aids and travel expenses for induction and internship is born by the student teacher herself. No fee is paid to the **RANI MATHA PUBLIC SCHOOL, FLOWER JN. JEWS STREET, KOCHI, KERALA**, by the student teacher with regard to Induction or Internship Programme. Any damages in the physical or infrastructural facilities brought to the **RANI MATHA PUBLIC SCHOOL, FLOWER JN. JEWS STREET, KOCHI, KERALA**, by the student teacher during the course of Induction or Internship is to be met by her. No remuneration is paid to the student teacher by the **RANI MATHA PUBLIC SCHOOL, FLOWER JN. JEWS STREET, KOCHI, KERALA**.

### **Code of conduct during the induction and internship period**

Item 8: The student teacher undertakes to abide by any employment rules set out by the **RANI MATHA PUBLIC SCHOOL, FLOWER JN. JEWS STREET, KOCHI, KERALA**, to facilitate the Program. The student agrees also to follow instruction and accept supervision throughout the induction and internship period.

### **Keeping confidentiality**

Item 9: The student teacher agrees to keep strict confidentiality. On no grounds is she to disclose information obtained over the course of the program which is deemed classified by the School Name.

### **Publication of result**

Item 10: The publicizing of research results gained by the student teacher over the period of her research is to take place only after consultation with SJCTEW and the **RANI MATHA PUBLIC SCHOOL, FLOWER JN. JEWS STREET, KOCHI, KERALA**, Period of validity of the **Memorandum of Understanding**

Item 11: This Memorandum of Understanding is valid for five years, effective from the date that its signing is concluded by representatives of SJCTEW and **RANI MATHA PUBLIC SCHOOL, FLOWER JN. JEWS STREET, KOCHI, KERALA**.

### **Termination/renewal of the Memorandum of Understanding**

Item 12: A period of six months notice is required in the case when either party SJCTEW or the **RANI MATHA PUBLIC SCHOOL, FLOWER JN. JEWS STREET, KOCHI, KERALA** wishes to terminate the agreement established in this Memorandum of Understanding. Any such wish

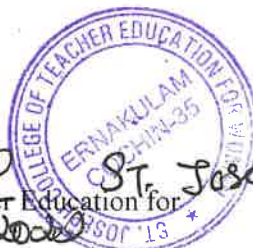

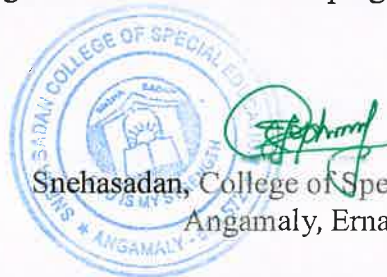

### 3. FUNDING:

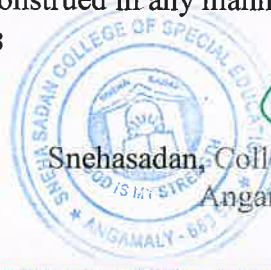
- a) Expenses for transportation, room and board and personal expenses of exchange students, teachers or officers shall be covered by each individual.
- b) Financial expenses for (term visits) internships of professors and researchers, which will be arranged at the parties' request, as well as travel expenses, shall be covered by the requesting institution. No fees will be paid, as the assumption is that the professors/ researchers remain in their positions at their home institution, which will continue to pay their salaries.

### 4. NO EMPLOYMENT RELATIONSHIP:

#### 7. TERM:

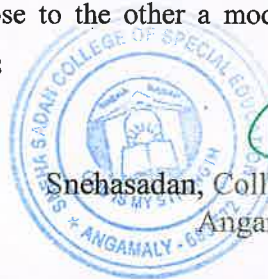

#### 10. CONFIDENTIALITY:

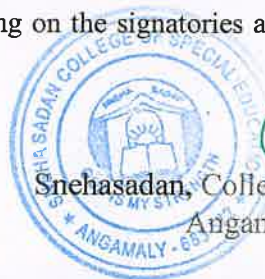


## Outreach Activity at Sneha Sadan Special School, 2022

### Programme Report

St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam organized an outreach activity at Sneha Sadan Special School in Pothiyakkara on 12<sup>th</sup> August 2022 from 10.30 AM to 2.00 PM. The major aim of the programme was to understand the facilities, programmes and functioning system of educational programs for the mentally challenged children in the special school. The student teachers from M Ed programme at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam were the beneficiaries for the outbreak activity.

As part of the outreach activity, the student teachers from M Ed programme at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam visited Sneha Sadan Special School, Pothiyakkara at 10.30 AM. Prior to the visit, the M Ed student teachers had contacted Sr. Celine, Headmistress of the Sneha Sadan Special School, Pothiyakkara. While the student teachers reached the school, the students at the special school was conducting a rally as part of the upcoming Independence Day celebration. The students were disguised as Bharat Matha and Mahatma Gandhi for the rally and it went well. The M Ed student teachers were asked to assemble at the portico of the special school. The Headmistress met the student teachers at the portico and asked the student teachers to introduce themselves. After that, the student teachers went for school tour to understand about the facilities and programmes of the school. The Sneha Sadan Special School, Pothiyakkara is recognized by the state government and also have a recognized name. There is plenty of land for the school building including a portico. The mission of the school is to mainstream children by imparting an integrated development program in a pleasant and stimulating environment. The goal of the school is to assist a physically or mentally challenged child to develop in normal living conditions and provide them with inclusive education. Their vision is the empowerment and integral development of the differently abled and socially marginalized 'The Special Children of God' creating and providing education infrastructure and other training programmes.

The staffs at the special school were very much cooperative. The student teachers could understand about the functioning of the school. There are more than 150 students and around 30 trained staff and non-teaching staffs at Sneha Sadan. The school functions in accordance with the rules of the government. The school is a residential one and the hostels for both boys and



girls are there but not in the same compound. There were staffs appointed to look after the hostel inmates. The fully fledged hostels have adequate facilities including dining room, kitchen, recreation hall, electric supply, water connection, bedrooms, furniture and latrines. The school also has a special syllabus for the students for their educational enhancement. All the students in the school is provided with individual attention and care at the school. The school follows 1:10 ratio classroom facility. The school has a great infrastructure and the facilities include library, ramp and rail facility, recreational activities, exercise room, prayer room, staff room and early intervention area. A computer lab facility is also arranged for the students to improve their technological knowledge. The school has special area for counselling and guidance and students receive counselling from trained counsellors. The counselling service is also provided for the parents of the special children. The school observes proper schedule and time for the systematic running of the institution, even though the time table is flexible. The students get proper break at proper intervals of time. The school has five class sections which includes, pre-primary, primary, secondary, pre-vocational and vocational for age groups including 3-6 years, 6-9 years, 9-12 years, 12-18 years and above 18 years respectively. Each class section follows proper time table. A specialized physiotherapist has been appointed for providing services to the students and the physiotherapist visits the school twice a week. As of now, a total of 15 students receive physiotherapy treatment and to be notable is the fact that most of the students follow the rules and are well disciplined. Speech therapy, behavioral therapy, occupational therapy, music, dance, Yoga and operational therapy are also provided for the needy students. Since the students are receiving various therapies according to their needs, the students get special training according to the depth of their disability. The school also helps students by providing training for self-helping skills. One of the major highlights of the school is that the teachers in the school follow different teaching methods and prepares activity lesson plans. The teacher employ special teaching strategy to teach the students. The teachers follow activity-oriented method and play-way method for the development and enhancement of interests of the students. Audio-visual aids have been used by the teachers for the betterment of the learning activities for students. Multi-sensory room facility is also used as a way to improve the senses of the students.

The M Ed student teachers could visit the building of the special school where vocational training is provided. The school imparts different vocational training programmes for the students. Book binding is one among the vocational training programme. The students help in

counting the pages and pasting the papers and the prepared books are sold to many schools which are under the CMC congregation. The school used to provide training for ornament making before covid-19 outbreak. The other vocational programmes provided by the school includes, soap making, candle making, mat making, card and cover making, agriculture, stitching and embroidery, and painting and drawing. After lunch break, the students in the special school were assembled at the portico and the M Ed. Student teachers conducted a few cultural activities to pep up the students. The outbreak activity at Sneha Sadan Special School, Pothiyakkara winded up at 2.00 PM.

The outbreak activity at Sneha Sadan Special School, Pothiyakkara was very productive and fruitful for the student teachers. The activity turned out to be successful in accomplishing its objectives. The student teachers could understand the facilities, programmes and functioning system of educational programs for the mentally challenged children in the special school. The activity made the student teachers to reflect on their own lives and to be grateful for what they have in their lives.

### **Purpose**

Item 1: With a view to training student teachers with the skills and knowledge necessary to serve as efficient and proficient teachers, SJCTEW has established an internship program with the **RANI MATHA PUBLIC SCHOOL, FLOWER JN. JEWS STREET, KOCHI, KERALA**, that will further the individual student teacher's education and develop the practical skills he or she will need for her future career.

### **Period of internship**

Item 2: The period to be engaged in by the student teacher is to be one month for the induction and four months for the internship

### **Content**

Item 3: The content of the Program and the manner in which the student teacher will be assigned is to be determined through consultation among all three parties (the school, SJCTEW and the student teacher).

### **Assigning the internship supervisor**

Item 4: The student's internship supervisor at the school is determined by the **Sr. Jeslin Abraham** (Headmistress, Rani Matha Public School, Flower Jn, Jews Street, Kochi, Kerala)

### **Conditions of the internship**

Item 5: The internship supervisor undertakes to report back to SJCTEW on the student teacher's progress over the course of the Program. The student's faculty supervisor at SJCTEW is to monitor the student teacher's progress in terms of how the Program fulfils her training goals. To this end, the faculty supervisor undertakes to visit the student at least once at the **RANI MATHA PUBLIC SCHOOL, FLOWER JN. JEWS STREET, KOCHI, KERALA**, during Induction and at least three times during the internship period in order to directly observe the student teacher's progress.

The internship supervisor and SJCTEW faculty supervisor are to submit evaluative reports to SJCTEW based upon their observations of the student teacher's performance over the period of her induction and internship.

### **Expenses**

Item 7: The expenses for teaching aids and travel expenses for induction and internship is born by the student teacher herself. No fee is paid to the **RANI MATHA PUBLIC SCHOOL, FLOWER JN. JEWS STREET, KOCHI, KERALA**, by the student teacher with regard to Induction or Internship Programme. Any damages in the physical or infrastructural facilities brought to the **RANI MATHA PUBLIC SCHOOL, FLOWER JN. JEWS STREET, KOCHI, KERALA**, by the student teacher during the course of Induction or Internship is to be met by her. No remuneration is paid to the student teacher by the **RANI MATHA PUBLIC SCHOOL, FLOWER JN. JEWS STREET, KOCHI, KERALA**.

### **Code of conduct during the induction and internship period**

Item 8: The student teacher undertakes to abide by any employment rules set out by the **RANI MATHA PUBLIC SCHOOL, FLOWER JN. JEWS STREET, KOCHI, KERALA**, to facilitate the Program. The student agrees also to follow instruction and accept supervision throughout the induction and internship period.

### **Keeping confidentiality**

Item 9: The student teacher agrees to keep strict confidentiality. On no grounds is she to disclose information obtained over the course of the program which is deemed classified by the School Name.

### **Publication of result**

Item 10: The publicizing of research results gained by the student teacher over the period of her research is to take place only after consultation with SJCTEW and the **RANI MATHA PUBLIC SCHOOL, FLOWER JN. JEWS STREET, KOCHI, KERALA**, Period of validity of the **Memorandum of Understanding**

Item 11: This Memorandum of Understanding is valid for five years, effective from the date that its signing is concluded by representatives of SJCTEW and **RANI MATHA PUBLIC SCHOOL, FLOWER JN. JEWS STREET, KOCHI, KERALA**.

### **Termination/renewal of the Memorandum of Understanding**

Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome is a chronic, perhaps fatal condition brought on by the Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV). The HIV weakens the capacity of our body to fight disease and infection by weakening the immune system. The HIV virus attacks and badly damages the immune system of the body of an individual and if not treated on time, could lead to the development AIDS which has no cure until now. It was mentioned in the presentation that the AIDS causing HIV is transmitted mainly via two means, firstly, through anal or vaginal sex, or when people share syringes, needles, or other drug injection tools. Secondly, via unprotected or risky sexual practices with someone who has been identified as HIV- positive. Only direct contact with specific bodily fluids, including blood, semen, pre-seminal fluid, rectal fluids, vaginal fluids and breast milk from an HIV-positive person with a detectable viral load can result in HIV infection.

A poster making competition was also held on the same day with the theme, 'End Inequalities, End AIDS'. An E-brochure regarding the competition was circulated among the student teachers in the college which was well coordinated by Ms. Dona K Jose, student teacher from Social Science optional, who is one among the Anti-Narcotic club members. Many student teachers from various optional actively participated in the poster making competition. All of the student teachers from Malayalam optional contributed in the competition who received special attention via their active participation and contribution. The competition results were announced on the same day based on the judgment of Dr. Soya Mathew, Assistant Professor at St. Joseph College of Teacher Education for Women, Ernakulam. 

Item 3: The content of the Program and the manner in which the student teacher will be assigned is to be determined through consultation among all three parties (the school, SJCTEW and the student teacher).


#### **Conditions of the internship**

To this end, the faculty supervisor undertakes to visit the student at least once at the **RANI MATHA PUBLIC SCHOOL, FLOWER JN. Item 6:

The internship supervisor and SJCTEW faculty supervisor are to submit evaluative reports to SJCTEW based upon their observations of the student teacher's performance over the period of her induction and internship.

### **Expenses**

Item 7: The expenses for teaching aids and travel expenses for induction and internship is born by the student teacher herself. No fee is paid to the **RANI MATHA PUBLIC SCHOOL, FLOWER JN. JEWS STREET, KOCHI, KERALA**, by the student teacher with regard to Induction or Internship Programme. Any damages in the physical or infrastructural facilities brought to the **RANI MATHA PUBLIC SCHOOL, FLOWER JN. JEWS STREET, KOCHI, KERALA**, by the student teacher during the course of Induction or Internship is to be met by her. No remuneration is paid to the student teacher by the **RANI MATHA PUBLIC SCHOOL, FLOWER JN. JEWS STREET, KOCHI, KERALA**.

### **Code of conduct during the induction and internship period**

Item 8: The student teacher undertakes to abide by any employment rules set out by the **RANI MATHA PUBLIC SCHOOL, FLOWER JN. JEWS STREET, KOCHI, KERALA**, to facilitate the Program. The student agrees also to follow instruction and accept supervision throughout the induction and internship period.

### **Keeping confidentiality**

Item 9: The student teacher agrees to keep strict confidentiality. On no grounds is she to disclose information obtained over the course of the program which is deemed classified by the School Name.

### **Publication of result**

Item 10: The publicizing of research results gained by the student teacher over the period of her research is to take place only after consultation with SJCTEW and the **RANI MATHA PUBLIC SCHOOL, FLOWER JN. JEWS STREET, KOCHI, KERALA**, **Period of validity of the Memorandum of Understanding**

Item 11: This Memorandum of Understanding is valid for five years, effective from the date that its signing is concluded by representatives of SJCTEW and **RANI MATHA PUBLIC SCHOOL, FLOWER JN. JEWS STREET, KOCHI, KERALA**.


### **Termination/renewal of the Memorandum of Understanding**

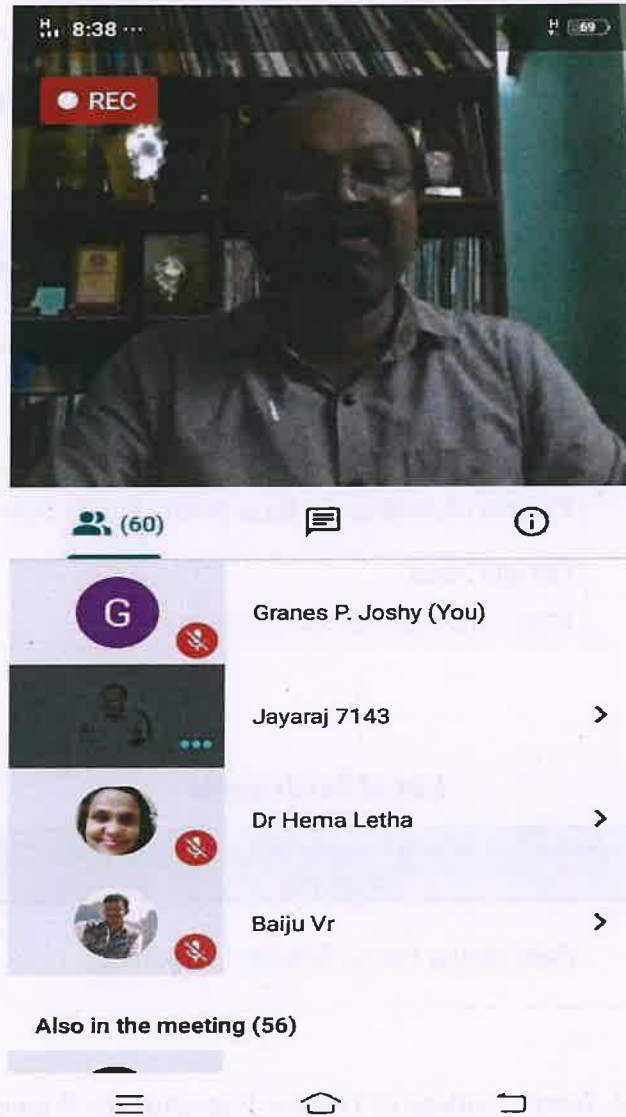
